DO NOT BE AFRAID

Matthew 21.1-11 // John 12.15 // Luke 5.10, 11 // Matthew 14.27

The Jews had been awaiting their King. They wanted a conquering General who could lead them to victory over their oppressors, Rome. In the meantime, Jesus had spent three years showing mercy to sinners, healing the sick, and casting out demons. Many believed, but some just wanted His miracles. But Jesus rode in on a donkey, a symbol of a King bringing peace. But Israel wanted a King on a war horse.

A KING TOO SMALL

We have the fears we have because quite frankly, our God is too small. Not that He is *actually* too small, but that we think He is.

Fear says, "what if." Faith says, "even if."

When we know the character and nature of our King, we are able to trust in Him, even if things don't go how we would like. We are able to pick up our cross and follow. We are able to live the life of faith that God calls us to live, to walk in the good deeds that He has prepared for us ahead of time. We are able to have the strength to get us through the Valley of the Shadow of Death. We are able to face each day with brand new mercy. We are able to forgive others. We are able to withstand peer pressure and the desire to fit in. We are able to overcome the darkest and lowest parts of life, not because He brings us away from them, but because He walks with us THROUGH THEM

THE MISSION OF GOD

From the beginning, God had a mission set in His heart, and He has created a church to accomplish that mission.

Later in the week, Jesus would return to the Mt. of Olives in order to prepare Himself to be betrayed and arrested. The next day, He would be crucified and killed. But He didn't stay in the grave, and after raising from the dead, He spent time with those faithful followers who worshiped this Prince of Peace, and in His final moments on the physical earth, He gave them the Great Commission, and from the Mt. of Olives, He ascended to heaven.
