FIGHTING FOR (NOT WITH) EACH OTHER

Galatians 5.14, 15 // November 1, 2020

IF YOU BITE AND DEVOUR

Psalm 133.1 // 1 Corinthians 1.10-12 // Philippians 2.1-4
1 Peter 3.8 // Galatians 5.16-21 // 1 Corinthians 3.3, 4, 13.1-3

Paul warned the various New Testament churches in multiple times and ways to be careful and mindful of not dividing. He says that when we bite and devour each other, we may eventually consume each other. This is completely against what it means to walk in the Spirit.

He even says to the Corinthians that even if they knew *everything* and even were being *burnt at the sake* for the Gospel, but lacked love, it was all nothing.

ACTING LIKE A NEW CREATION

The one thing Christian believers are not to do when engaged in conflict is to revert back to our old, pre-conversion, flesh-driven ways of behavior.

Jesus has saved us, not so that we can stay the same and act how we always have, but so that He would change us to be more like Him and then send us out as ministers of reconciliation. He does not need the strength of our flesh and human wisdom and ways to bring Him glory. Rather, He calls us to repent and have our minds renewed and transformed.

WHAT THEN?

How ought we go about living out our convictions and even voicing our opinions? All of our conversations, thoughts, opinions, attitudes, words, and social media posts ought to be saturated with the fruit of the Spirit. James says that a "harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace."

Repent and Confess

o Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.

Ask for Provision

o Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

Yield with Thanksgiving

End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
