

LET THE REDEEMED OF THE LORD SAY SO

Psalm 107

REMEMBERING THE WORK OF THE LORD

God has done amazing works among us, yet it is so easy for us to take for granted where He has brought us from. Psalm 107 says that if we are aware of God’s steadfast love in our life, we should “say so.” Cultivating perpetual gratitude is a necessary choice that we must be persistent in, lest we flounder in hopelessness and despair.

This psalm describes four different types of circumstances that people get into, and what they did in the midst of it. More importantly, it tells us what God’s response was.

1. Wandering Empty and Apart from God and His People: vs. 4-9

This person is one that has been wandering through life, finding nowhere to settle. This person can’t find a “city to dwell in.” Ultimately, this “city” speaks of Christ, but also as the people of God, as Zion is the City of God that represents God unified with His people. This person wanders and is hungry and thirsty.

2. Rebellion that Brings Isolation: vs. 10-16

This person has become a prisoner of their own sin. They willfully rebel against God’s Word, and went against His Wisdom. God, in turn, brings about consequences that were difficult, so much so, that they were left in isolation.

3. Sin Brought Suffering and Near Death: vs. 17-22

Similar to the previous person, this one had their sin take them further than they planned, and they even suffered physical and tangible affliction. They couldn’t even eat, maybe because sickness or just loss of appetite, and even were brought near to death. Sometimes, our sin has actual health consequences, like addictions, some diseases like STD’s, etc.

4. Storms of Life: vs. 23-32

This person was going about life, doing business, maybe providing for a family, but all of this was done in their own strength. God brought about a storm, and it devastated their life. Everything was gone, and it was out of their control, and not necessarily because of sin. They came to their wit’s end, as their own abilities had dried up.

A FINAL WORD TO THE WISE

Verses 33 to 43 give us a synopsis of what God does among us, and the psalmist tells us that if we desire to be wise, we ought to give thought and thanks to the steadfast love of God.

Isaiah 41.10 // Psalm 91.14-16 // John 6.35-40

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read **Psalm 107**. What stands out in this passage, and what stuck out to you most from the sermon on Sunday?

Which of those four types of people do you most relate to? What are the things that you would "Say So" and give God thanks for as you look upon His faithfulness in your life this past year?

Spend time in prayer, praying through the themes of Psalm 107 using the **P.R.A.Y.** model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love.

- **Preaching the Gospel to Yourself**
 - Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.
- **Repent and Confess**
 - Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.
- **Ask for Provision**
 - Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.
- **Yield with Thanksgiving**
 - End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
