MISSING THE MARK

Isaiah 59:2 (ESV)

² but your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you so that he does not hear.

Sin causes a separation, and although we might think we've only done "little sins," we have to remember that it isn't necessarily the sin itself that is the problem, but who we sin against. Totaling a beat up 1987 Ford Escort isn't near as costly as even just a scratch on a Rolls Rovce Sweptail.

THE RESCUE PLAN

Although Adam and Eve (and every human since!) should rightly be punished for the ways in which we turn against God, God instead promised that He would actually send a hero to rescue them from their own rebellion! And God did not want us to be in the dark on this, but even gave us many, many ways to know for sure who the Messigh is.

The odds of someone fulfilling these prophecies at random is statistically impossible. Consider just a few of these scientifically proven statistics:

- To fulfill just eight prophecies at random, you would have a 1 in 1,000,000,000,000,000,000 chance of doing so, that's 1 in 10^{17} (100 Quintillion).
- To fulfill 30, you would have to hollow out NINE earths and fill them with dimes, and find the ONE red-painted dime blindfolded.
- Jesus, however, fulfilled over 300 written about Him, including 30 in just one specific day. If this were a random man, it would be impossible, but this was not random, this was planned, and this was very intentional.

Jesus was born so that He would die. And through His death He paid the price so that we could be born again.

- C. Confess your faith in Him, Confess your need for Him and ask for Him to come into your life to make you alive and make you new.

This week and next our Community Groups will be on break. But still take time to memorize the Memory Verse for this week!

Sermon Notes Extras:

His heritage:

- He'd be of the seed of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, Genesis 12.3 // Matthew 1.1, 2
- From the Tribe of Judah, one of Jacob's 12 sons. Genesis 49.10
- He would be a descendant of David and Jesse, David's father, Jeremiah 23.5, 6

His birth and early life:

- Born of a woman, who is also a virgin. Isaiah 7.14 // Matthew 3.13, 21.11, 26.69
- He would be born in Bethlehem. Micah 5.2 // Luke 2.1-7
- Though born in Bethlehem. He would be a Galilean. Isaigh 9.1
- He and His family would flee into Egypt to save His life. Hosea 11.1 // Matthew 2.13-15

His adult life:

- In Malachi 3.1, Malachi says to God "the Messenger of the Covenant in whom You delight" will come to the temple. This may not seem like a big deal, the Messiah going to the temple, but knowing that the temple has been destroyed since 70 AD leaves the Jews unable to expect the Messiah after that.
- He'll be preceded by someone announcing His coming. Isaiah 40.3 // Matthew 3.1-3
- He will ride into Jerusalem on a young donkey. Zechariah 9.9 // Luke 19.28-38

His betrayal and death:

- He'll be betrayed by a friend who ate bread with Him. Psalm 41.9 // Matthew 26.49, 50
- This 'friend' will betray Him by handing Him over to the authorities for thirty pieces of silver; then, that payment would be thrown down to the potter in the temple, which is a burying place for strangers. Zechariah 11.12, 13 // Matthew 27.5-7
- He will be rejected, beaten, mocked, and have His beard plucked out. Isaiah 50.6, 53.3 // Matthew 26.67, 27.39-44
- His clothes will be gambled for. Psalm 22.18 // John 19.23, 24
- He would be scourged and crucified; yet crucifixion was not invented until hundreds of years after this prophecy. Psalm 22.16 // Isaiah 53.5 // Luke 23.33
- He won't be executed not alone, but alongside sinners. Isaiah 53.12 // Matthew 27.38
- None of His bones will be broken. This is significant because due to the method of crucifixion (which again, wasn't invented for hundreds of more years), executioners would break the legs of the condemned in order to speed up the process of death. This was part of the command for the Passover lamb in **Exodus**, that the Hebrews were not to break any bones of the lamb. It was a foreshadowing of the Lamb of God. Exodus 12.46 // Psalm 34.20 // John 19.32-36
- He would be buried in a tomb owned and donated by a rich man. Isaiah 53.9 // Matthew 27.57-60
- He'll raise from the grave after bearing the world's sin. Isaiah 53.10, 11 // Acts 2.32
