MOVING FORWARD

QUESTIONS to CONSIDER

- Who are you accountable to and who truly knows you? Who frequently confronts your blind spots and sin? Does the relationship point you to Jesus and the Gospel and help you "put on the armor" for you when it's too heavy and you are too weak? If no one, why not? Where's the road block?
- 2. When was the last time you asked someone to speak into your life concerning sin and blind spots? When they do, what was your response?
- **3.** Ask these people if they feel comfortable confronting you, or if they avoid it because they either fear you will become angry, defensive, or very hurt.

Before group starts, who can share the Memory Verse?

Read **Philippians 1.27, 28.** What stands out in this passage, and what stuck out to you most from the sermon on Sunday?

Read through the questions in the "Notes" section. In what ways have others helped you see blind spots and areas of your life that need change?

Your Life Mission

It has already been a rough start to 2021. There are many who are looking for hope for a better year, but we know that the changing of a number alone can't do that. But we do have hope to give. Which relationships or get-togethers might be in your future that you would like prayer for, to help them hopefully see their need for the Prince of Peace in their lives?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the **P.R.A.Y.** model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love.

- Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)
 - Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.
- Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)
 - Real repentance begins where blame-shifting stops. Your circumstances don't need to change, your heart needs to change. Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.

Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

• Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

• Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

• End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
