Acts 8.25-40 // October 23, 2022

THE "NATURAL" WORK OF THE SPIRIT

Philip was one of the seven men appointed to serve the Grecian widows in Acts 6. On his way to Gaza, the Holy Spirit leads him to approach a chariot.

It is easy for us to miss the work of the Spirit in our lives. But as we pray to have His will become our will, we ought to be expectant that this actually happens.

As Philip obeys, he just...acts natural. He asks questions. He accepts an invitation to climb into the chariot and just talk.

THE HEART IS THE TARGET

Once Philip is invited into the chariot, he knows that his task now is to try to find a way to share the Gospel of Jesus with the Ethiopian.

Just as all roads lead to Rome, all emotions lead to the heart.

One thing that evangelism, counseling, parenting, discipleship, or dealing with sin has in common is that the heart is always the target. To find our way into the heart, we look for "access points" that reveal what is in the heart. One of the best ways to find those access points is by listening for emotive words, such as "feel," "sad," "scared," "anxious," or even positive words like "excited," "overjoyed," or "satisfied"

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before group starts, who can share the Memory Verse?

Read **Acts 8.25-40.** What stands out in this passage and from the sermon on Sunday?

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself

It is easy to feel inadequate or underqualified to share the Gospel. But how does Philip's interaction with the Ethiopian encourage you in your own life mission that God has called you to?

Your Life Mission

What are some ways that you have seen God use you in a "naturally supernatural" way? What are ways that you have recognized that He has aligned your will with His, and maybe you didn't realize it until recently? What are some "Gaza Road" situations that you find yourself in that you think you can be more intentional and expectant for the work of God to lead you into a conversation or finding an "in road" to others' hearts?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the **P.R.A.Y.** model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love.

• Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

o Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.

• Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)

o Real repentance begins where blame-shifting stops. Your circumstances don't need to change, your heart needs to change. Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.


• Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

• Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

 End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
