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#### COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

| Read <b>Colossians 3.6-14.</b> What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday or from these verses?  |
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| Of the list of "verbal sins" we can commit, which is the one that is most challenging or convicting? Why do you think you are prone to it? In other words, read <b>Matthew 15.17-20</b> . Going on last week's study on idolatry, what idol in your heart is being worshiped that is causing these verbal sins? |
| Read <b>James 3.1-12.</b> What particularly sticks out to you in these verses?  |
| So often we do as James says, we speak blessing and curse out of the same mouth, often in the same day, same hour, or even same sentence! What does this tell us about our heart, and what hope do we have if this is true?   |
| On Sunday, Jobey mentioned how things like complaining and bitterness reveal to us how much we may or may not understand and actually believe the Gospel. Why do you think that is?   |
| When you think of the particular sins you battle, and what they pertain to (for instance, who do you gossip about or what do you complain about), what part of the Gospel do you think you are having a hard time believing?  |
| Our failures can (and should) always be used as doorways to God's grace. Explain what you think that means, and how you can utilize that truth when it comes to the verbal sins you are dealing with.   |
| What does Paul say in this Colossians text that is the key to putting off this particular sin?  |
| Read <b>John 17.17, 8.32,</b> and <b>1 Thessalonians 2.13.</b> What do these verses tell us on how we can pick up the "accent" of God's native language, which is truth?  |
| Spend some time as a group going ground where each person shares  |

Spend some time as a group, going around where each person shares something they have been learning about Christ and the Gospel, or giving God thanks for something God has done. Let's put into practice the command Paul gives us in verses 12-14.
