THE HEART OF IDOLATRY

Colossians 3.5-7 // Proverbs 27.20 // James 1.14, 15

Your flesh will never try to convince you in broad terms that a particular sin is not wrong,
But it will try to convince you that your instance of that particular sin is an exception.

Sin is a worship issue. It's an opportunity to ask "why am I doing this?" Rather than just trying to get rid of it, find out the source. Ask, "what is it that I think is more beautiful than Christ?" Our sin is smoke from the altar of idolatry; it is like physical pain, which is a symptom of something wrong under the surface.

SEXUAL SIN

At the heart of sexual sin is that we really believe, "God, you're not true. I can't trust You to be good, and I can't trust You to provide my needs and my ultimate satisfaction." Sexual sin exposes to us that we worship our own desires above God's desires, and that we see ourselves as more wise than He is.

Read Galatians 5.13 and Romans 13.13, 14. What are the "opportunities" and "provisions" for the flesh that are in your life that need to be addressed? What that means is that, we often put ourselves in situations that give our flesh room to lash out. It could be certain company, certain places, or certain activities. Remember, however, that abstaining from these things alone does not change your heart, but that when we do abstain from some things, it gives the Gospel a much clearer path into our heart, because our heart is not wrapped up in idolatry. Ask someone to help keep you accountable in these areas.
