COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Luke 1.71-75. What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday or from these verses?
On Sunday, Jobey talked about how Jesus came to conquer our enemies. Whose enemies will be conquered? And who are the fathers? Read Micah 7:20, Romans 9.6-8, 11.11-24 and Ephesians 2.11-3.6. Who are considered these fathers' "children"?
By God's grace, we who are Gentiles have been adopted into the family of Israel! We are "partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel." We now share both their promises and victories over their enemies.
Although the Word tells us that God is "slow to anger" and his timing is perfect, God's patience will run out on our enemies. Read Ecclesiastes 12.14, Acts 17.31, and Matthew 8.28-29. What do these verses say about God's plot against our enemies?
Who is the last enemy to be conquered? Read 1 Corinthians 15.24-26. What do you think the significance is that this is, first of all, called an enemy, and second of all, is the last one to be destroyed?
Practically speaking, how does knowing that in God's perfect plan against the enemy, that He will have ultimate vengeance change how you move forward in your life?
Read Zechariah's prophecy through verse 75 again. What did he say should be the result of us seeing the big picture of the Redeemer's victory over our enemies?
Why do you think God allows, and even causes, some tragedies and suffering? What truths, or even examples from the Word, can you press into your heart <i>now</i> in order to prepare you for the times that you will face your own hardships?
Read James 5.7-9 . How does the example of a farmer help you gain perspective on the times of hardship in your life?
Close by reading Romans 8.18 and 2 Corinthians 4.16-18 . Pray as a group thanking God for sending Jesus to save us for our from our enemies, and asking Him to press these truths into our minds to give us an eternal perspective on our life each and every day.
