Matthew 20.20-34

### SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Matthew 20.20-28

Here, the mother of James and John ask a favor of Jesus. Clearly not understanding how the Lord's "economy" works, she wants her sons to be exalted in the Kingdom. Jesus foretells that they would be at His left and right hand, but in a way that they weren't looking for. Both of them, like their Lord, would suffer and die for the sake of the Kingdom.

## JESUS IS OUR EXAMPLE

Here we get an insight from Jesus as to the nature of His relationship with the Father. It is important for us to see this if we are to grow in our relationship with Him as well as with others.

- God the Father and Son (and Spirit for that matter) are One, and are completely equal in their essence, nature, power, and being.
- They are different, however, in their roles, and they are not the same Person (e.g., the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Spirit, etc.).
- Though totally equal in nature, the Son gladly submits to the Father, and even in another sense of the word, "submits" Himself to us as a servant.

Romans 5.8

Jesus models servant leadership, humbling Himself to others who are truly lower than Him, all throughout His ministry. Even here after this conversation, He turns to serve those who are blind and needy.

# HOW CAN WE FOLLOW?

We want to become like Jesus in every way, following His example, even to "drink the cup" as James and John did. How do we come to this point? We seek to behold and enjoy and be mesmerized by the beauty of our Servant King, Jesus. When we are humbled by His service to us, it melts our hearts for others.

## COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 20:20-34. What stood out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

What do you think was the heart of the mother and her two sons discussed in Matthew 20:20-23? In other words, what were they seeking? What did they seem to think they deserved?

What do you think Christ meant when he said, "[T]o sit at my right hand and at my left is not mine to grant . . . "? Does this passage call into question Christ's authority? What does it tell us about Christ's relationship with His Father? See Matthew 26:39 and 42, and Philippians 2:5-8.

Re-read Matthew 20:25-28. Explain in your own words what you think Jesus is telling His disciples? Is there really something inherently wrong about ambition? Doesn't Paul tell us to run so as to win the race in 1 Corinthians 9:24? How do we reconcile these passages?

Read Psalm 100:2, Proverbs 3:34, John 13:3-16, and James 2:1-5. How does our current culture react to the suggestion that we humble ourselves and serve others? What do you think our world's current reaction would be to a God who washes the feet of His followers? What is Christ showing us through His washing of His disciples' feet, and how does this relate to what He is teaching in Matthew 20:20-28?

We see Jesus healing two blind men in Matthew 20:29-34. How does that relate to what we just saw him teach in verses 20-28? What did the men do after Jesus healed them? What is Christ's ultimate goal in his acts of worldly grace, such as healing?

Christ's death on the cross is the ultimate demonstration of His grace, mercy, love and servanthood toward us, and ultimately, toward His Father. See John 15:13 and Romans 5:7-10. What is your reaction when you reflect on the fact that Christ, the perfect Son of God, took your guilt on Himself on the cross when you were undeserving of and powerless to attain this gift?

Spend some time in prayer reflecting on the fact that Christ has already done all for you, and what your reaction to that truth should be. Using the P.R.A.Y. model, reflect on the truth that you were once dead in your sin, but it was only through Christ's great grace, mercy, and love that you have found his favor, and seek earnestly his will for your life.
