Marks of National Citizenship:

- Constitution: Protections and rights are defined in our Constitution.
- Passport: Proves your identity and invokes your rights; it bears the seal of the issuing country, the promise of that country to uphold its promises.
- Personal Allegiance and Self-Identity: As citizens, we are committed to our nation's good. We have an identity in our nationality.

Marks of Heavenly Citizenship:

- Constitution: Our protections and rights are defined in the Word of God.
- Passport: The cross of Christ invokes your rights; it bears the seal of the Holy Spirit, Who is also know as the seal of promise.
- Personal Allegiance and Self-Identity: As citizens, we are committed to the King
 of kings. Our identity is now in our true homeland as people who have been
 grafted into the Commonwealth of Israel.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before group starts, is there anyone who can recite the week's memory verse?

Reread and review the sermon passage, Philippians 3:17-21. When was a time vou made a decision or acted in a certain way that others around you were surprised because it wasn't the "normal" or "common" way to respond, but rather was a biblical response?

What was your response when they either asked or wondered why you acted that way?

Do you typically think of yourself as being a citizen of Heaven? Have you ever described yourself as a citizen of Heaven? How could you explain this citizenship to a non-believing friend or coworker, or even another Christian?

Read Ephesians 2:18-22. How does Paul describe our citizenship in heaven? Who are our fellow citizens?

Read John 15:19, Romans 12:1-2, 2 Corinthians 6:14-18, and 1 Peter 1:16. How are we distinct (foreigners) from this world? What else could we be doing or not doing to enhance that distinction? There are many more references in the Bible to being set apart. Feel free to find and discuss others if time permits.

How can we be more heavenly minded? Read Hebrews 11:13-16. Do you have a heavenly, godly desire as a heavenly citizen to see His Kingdom promoted here on earth, or do you have an ungodly contentment or pursuit of your earthly citizenship? Consider these primary main ways we show our allegiance. How would you like to grow in your pursuit of your heavenly citizenship in these areas?
