JUSTIFICATION BY FAITH ALONE

Romans 1.16, 17, 3.21-26

JUSTIFICATION: THE WHAT AND THE HOW

First: the Problem - Romans 3.23

Romans 3.23 says that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." This is our problem. And since God is just and good Judge, He can't just "look the other way." Sin must be dealt with, and sinners must be punished.

Second: the Desire - Romans 3.26

However, God *does* desire two things: He wants to righteously deal with sin, satisfying His justice, but He *also* wants to show His mercy. This is God's "problem."

Third: the Source - Romans 3.24

If this were able to even happen, where would the source of this justification come from? Do we initiate this forgiveness? Do we seek the ear of the King so we can make our plea?

God's love is the source, not result, of the atonement. The atonement didn't procure grace, it flowed from grace. God doesn't love us because Christ died for us, Christ died for us because God loves us. -P.T. Forsyth

Fourth: the Grounds - Romans 3.24, 25, 5.9

So the source is God's grace. But we know He must be just. So how does He reconcile this problem? We see that a satisfactory price was paid: redemption was purchased when the Judge's penalty was paid and His righteous anger toward sin was satisfied. This is called "propitiation." The payment is His blood, and this is what saves us.

Fifth: the Means - Romans 1.17, 3.25

So how do we receive it? Is it *now* earned? No, it is received by faith. Nothing more, and nothing less. This is why we say, "by grace, through faith."

Sixth: the Effects - Romans 5.6-11

We are not just simply forgiven now. That would be great, but being forgiven means "yes, you sinned, but I will now look the other way." This would be like amnesty, which shares a root with the word "amnesia." But justification is better than that. Justification makes us able to be actually *reconciled* with God. We are not just simply forgiven, but we are made to be just, to be righteous. We're not just "forgiven," but we are "not guilty."

FUTURE GRACE

And yet it still doesn't end there. Being forgiven helps us overcome our past, but being justified helps us to stand in the present, and into the future.

Two More Important Effects of Justification:

- 1. Sanctification: God will continue the work that He began in us.
- 2. **Glorification:** He will hold you and be with you always, even to the end of the age. He will be faithful, even when you are faithless. He will never leave you nor forsake you.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read **Romans 1.16, 17, 3.21-26** Take some time and discuss what God revealed to you through His Word and the sermon on Sunday?

Why do we need to be justified? Without cheating by looking at the sermon notes, what two desires did God have (verse 26)? What was the motivating source for each of those desires (verse 24 and 26)?

How do we receive justification? Do we first approach God for forgiveness? Do we do certain actions to earn it?

Read **Romans 1:16-17**. Why is the righteousness of God revealed? How are we to walk? Do you currently feel as though you are walking this way, or do you walk out your salvation as if your works could save you or preserve you?

Read **Romans 5:6-11**. What is the difference between forgiveness and justification? How did God, being righteous judge, make this possible for us, and why? (verse 8).

Read **2 Corinthians 5:21**. What happened to Jesus, and why? What does it mean that "we have become the righteous of God?" ______

This justification makes us able to actually be RECONCILED to God. How does this change our outlook on how you live day to day?

What has the Cross of Christ purchased for you? How is God's grace toward you ongoing in your life, not just for forgiveness for a moment in the past, but for today, and even for tomorrow? How does this affect the way you perceive grace?

Spend some time in praying for encouragement to depend on God's grace to believe your standing in Christ, as well as let that standing be the basis of your fight against today's and tomorrow's sin and struggles.
