Philippians 4.14-20

THE IMPORTANCE OF GENEROUS PARTNERSHIP

Partnership: this is the word "koinonia," which we use for communion and fellowship. It is a word that is used to denote the intimate commitment of unity among families, friendships, and business relationships.

Paul thanks them for the gifts he received, but what he is most thankful for is the evidence of Gospel fruit in their lives. He is excited just for the simple fact that they are giving generously, and that they will be rewarded with fruit in their lives.

GENEROSITY GROWS DEPENDENCY

Philippians 4.19, 20 // 1 Timothy 5.17, 18 // 1 Corinthians 9.13, 14

We must remember always that what we want to see happen in and through our lives and our church is not simply difficult, it is impossible. Apart from Christ, we cannot do what we hope to see happen in and through us. We must grow in our dependency on the Lord.

The heart of true fellowship is self-sacrificing conformity to shared vision.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read Philippians 4:14-20. What stuck out to you from this verse or the message on Sunday?

In verse 17, Paul says, "but I seek the fruit that increases to your credit." What is Paul talking about here?

Re-read verse 18. What is at the heart of giving? In other words, what are you doing when you are being generous?

In your own words, define generosity. Using your own definition, do you feel as if God has been generous to you? Why or why not? Read John 3:16.

Verse 19 reads, "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." Does this mean God will give us whatever we want because we're generous? What is Paul saying here?

In what ways has God provided for all your needs in ways that you either didn't expect or maybe you wanted Him to supply in a different way? Are there areas in your life where you feel like God has not supplied all of your needs?

When we think of generosity, we immediately think of money. In what other ways can you be generous?

Read Mark 12:41-44. Would you consider yourself a generous person? If yes, how can you continue to grow in this? If you're not, what is holding you back and have you seen any fruit/growth in this area? What will you do in order to grow in generosity?

Spend time praying with each other. Pray with the heart of Psalm 67 that asks God to bless us, but not for the purpose of being blessed, but so that we can be a blessing to others. Ask Him to show you how you can grow through being generous.
