WHO DEFINES SPIRITUALITY?

John 1.1-18

The bible tells us that when God came to the earth, we did not receive Him. Even though His purpose in coming was to bring us true peace, joy, and life, we didn't like, nor did we want, and ignored it. We "suppressed" the truth.

Ways We Suppress the Truth

- We are self-sufficient and "self-made" (or so we think)
- We create our own standard of righteousness and morality
- We have a self-imposed and self-defined spirituality.

OUR NEED FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS

John 6.58-69

Jesus tells His listeners that He came to give life, that He Himself is how life is received. But they reject Him. He then tells them a hard truth: you can't have spiritual life on your own. It's not up to you. Why? Because we don't even have the authority to walk into a grocery store that's closed for the night, let alone into eternal life. We are not the ones who define the way it works.

WHAT THE SPIRIT DOES

This is a tough pill to swallow, as many of us are "pretty good" people by our own standards. But in ourselves, we are still not "good enough" for God's standard. Yet God creates a solution, and we see even that He IS the solution!

John 3.3-8, 16-19 // 1 Peter 1.23 // John 16.13

The Spirit of God is given to us to help us see the very truths we ignore and suppress. He opens our eyes to see both our need for forgiveness and a righteousness that does not come from our own failed efforts, as well as see the beautiful gift of Jesus, who came and then gives us His own righteousness so that we *can* truly know God and have a true, life giving spirituality.

The Reliability of the Bible:


- 1. Manuscript Evidence. There are 24,000 Copies, all written between 100 and 300 years after the original. Compare the writings of Caesar: 10 copies, 1000 year gap, and Plato: 7 copies, 1200 year gap.
- 2. Early Church Fathers who either knew the Apostles personally or heard them speak, quoted them 19,000 times in their own writings. Even without early manuscripts, we have enough quotes from first hand witnesses that we could nearly construct the entire NT.

3. The oldest OT manuscript we had was from 700 AD. When we found the Dead Sea Scrolls, they were 1000 years OLDER! You'd expect many "man made changes." But they were word for word in more than 95%, and the other 5% were insignificant slips of the pen and misspellings.

- 4. Archaeological Evidence. Archaeological discoveries have verified and confirmed the accuracy of the historical and cultural references in the Bible time and time again.
- 5. Eyewitness Accounts. The Bible was written by people who witnessed the events it describes; many were persecuted or martyred but never changed their story. Would you die for something you knew was untrue?
- 6. Corroborating Accounts. There are plenty of references in non-biblical sources to the events described in the Bible. The Jewish secular historian Josephus, born in 37 AD.
- 7. Literary Consistency. The Bible contains 66 books written over 1,500 years by 40 different writers, 3 continents, 3 languages, but it tells one "big story" of God's plan of salvation that culminated in Jesus Christ.
- 8. Prophetic Consistency. There are over 300 specific prophecies in the Old Testament that are fulfilled in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ in the New Testament
