PROPHETS AND PROPHECY

1 Corinthians 14.1-5

WHAT IS PROPHECY?

Throughout church history, many, many gifted theologians have differed on what New Testament prophecy and prophets are. The Puritans believed it to be gifted preaching and spiritual application of the Scriptures, some believe it's direct words and direction from God, others believe it's subtle inklings and impressions.

However, it seems that there is continuity between the Old and New Testament prophets. Paul puts prophets on par concerning their authority and importance alongside apostles, saying that the church is built upon their foundation.

Ephesians 2.19-21, 4.11-13

CONTINUATIONISM VS. CESSATIONISM

Continuationism

- The gifts are all still for today.
- Still speak in tongues, prophesy, and have signs and miracles today.
- o Ranges from Pentecostal, to Charismatic, to "Cautious but Open."

Cessationism

- Certain gifts such as prophecy, tongues, and some miraculous gifts have ceased.
- Their purpose in establishing the foundation of the church had been fulfilled
- o Ranges from complete Cessationism to "Cautious but Open."

It seems unlikely that God would appoint infallible apostles to partner with fallible prophets. It seems that the New Testament prophets were one in the same as the Old Testament prophets, but that the office of apostle and prophet fulfilled its purpose at some point in history.

WHAT ABOUT TODAY?

There is still an experience that many believers encounter, that is probably not biblical "prophecy" but is nonetheless a real experience.

Speaking and Thinking Naturally Supernatural:

Speaking spontaneous spiritual counsel to a friend, praying for someone who comes to mind, feeling led to speak or act.

Sovereign Speech:

Bringing up certain topics out of the blue in conversation, "coincidences," etc. Faith Filled Exhortation:

Feeling a strong conviction to share with someone. Be careful not to overspiritualize a strong conviction or opinion.

No-Go Zone:

For others and yourself, be very, very cautious of declaring "the Lord told me."

Some of this is semantics, and some is not. Regardless, semantics often matter greatly.

Repent and Confess

Ask for Provision

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love.
