Psalm 103

PREACHING TO SELF

Psalm 103

Psalm 103, along with others, gives us an example of meditation that is different than most of the other Psalms. In this one, David is writing and directing this Psalm to himself, as a form of self-preaching. The theologians of yesteryear called it "soliloquy," which is akin to talking or muttering to yourself, and in this case, preaching truth to youself.

Our problem is that our default position is to "listen to ourselves," rather than "preach to ourselves." We default by meditating on things that discourage or worry us. So here, David begins with the command to self to "bless the Lord, O my soul!" To "bless the Lord" is to honor Him by delighting in Him and recognizing Him with thanks and praise.

WAYS WE PREACH TO THE SOUL

Memorization: one of the great strengths of memorization is that informs, shapes, and gives perspective to every other aspect of life, from your prayer life, giving counsel to friends, sharing your faith with non-believers, and, most importantly, deepening your love and passion for Jesus.

Proverbs 7.1-3 // Psalm 119.9-11 // James 1.22-26 John 17.17, 8.31, 32, 15.10, 11

People: There are many times we find ourselves too weak, dry, apathetic, beat up, obstinate, discouraged, or hard hearted. In these moments, we need people to help us meditate. We need the Gospel from the body of Christ and the prayers of the body of Christ that point us back to the truth of God.

Ephesians 5.18-21 // Colossians 3.16, 17

Song: The bible calls us, commands us even, to sing, and to sing together. We come to and sing to respond to God, and we sing as a gift to God but also as a means to preach to self and preach to others.

FINDING JESUS IN THE PSALMS

Ultimately, these Psalms help us to respond to the Lord and have our minds, hearts, attitudes, and perspective shaped by the truth of God. Through the Psalms, we can praise the Lord either by singing to Him, or singing about Him. Similar to our human relationships, we can either praise someone directly to them, or we can praise them in front of other people. Either way, this is how we "bless" them.

As no doubt you can already see, these ways we "preach to self" are not only ways that we praise God, but they also aren't clean delineations. They blend with each other. We sing songs, yes, but we sing together. We sing songs together that have truths we have memorized, and the songs help us memorize them. All of this is by God's design, that our lives and hearts might be shaped by Him and His truth, rather than temporary circumstances that will come and go.

Praising Him helps us enter the real world.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before discussion begins, is there anyone who can recite the memory verse?

Read Psalm 103. What impacted you the most from these verses or from Sunday's message?

Now read Proverbs 7:1-3, Psalm 119:9-11, James 1:22-26, John 17:17, John 8:31-32 and John 15:10-11. For the past few weeks, we've been learning about the importance of meditating on and memorizing Scripture. What are some of the benefits to memorizing the Word? And why is it so important?

One of the big reasons that preaching the Gospel to yourself is so important is because we so often "listen to lies" instead of believe the truth. When this happens, where do you run? How can you discipline yourself to store the Word in your heart (Psalms 119:9-11) so that you can preach to yourself instead of listen to yourself?

Read Colossians 3:16-17. Who have you been encouraging lately and being a blessing to with words of blessing? How are you helping them "treasure up" (Proverbs 7:1-3) the Word? Is someone else encouraging you? If not why and if not where can you start?


Psalms 96:1-2 says "Sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day!" In these two verses "sing to the Lord" is mentioned 3 times! If singing to the Lord is so important than why do so many Christians show up to church in the middle of the first or second song during morning worship? How can you help show others the value in "singing to the Lord" collectively as a church body on Sundays?

What are some of your favorite worship songs? What is your favorite line or verse of that song and why?

Spend some time as a group praying together, praising God together, and encouraging one another in prayer. Consider taking sections of Psalm 103 and having a few people "pray" those truths among the group.
