CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND JOY

Psalm 32, 51, and 6

THE GOAL OF REPENTANCE

Psalm 32

There are three commands in **Psalm 32**:

- Pray while God may be found
- Don't be like a mule who lacks understanding
- Be glad in the Lord, rejoice, and shout for joy.

The goal of repentance is not to make you pay. The goal is to make you glad.

PRAYING UGLY PRAYERS OF REPENTANCE

First, it's important to note that repentance isn't so much a prayer itself or what you say. "Confession" is the spoken part that comes before repentance. First we confess, then we repent, in other words, then we turn away from our sinful ways. We confess our sin and ask God to give us a repentant heart, a will, desire, and strength to actually act upon our confession. That is what a prayer of repentance is.

God is more comfortable with you pouring out your heart to Him than you are.

Our prayers must have "no deceit" (verse 2). Confession is not just admitting what you have done, but it is confessing it for what it really is: vile, repulsive sin against God.

Psalm 51.1-4 // Psalm 32.5-11 // Psalm 6

When sin is wasting you away on the inside, you should not expect to have neatly organized prayers. It will be messy and ugly when you unleash true confession and prayers for repentance. It is better to offer up ugly prayers with no deceit than to offer perfectly crafted religious prayers that just tend to cover over the filthiness of sin.

WHERE WE GET OUR CONFIDENCE

The New Testament not only echoes the claims of David, but also gives more clarity. If David's musing in Psalm 32 and 51 seem potentially like he is wishfully thinking or assuming that the Lord doesn't desire sacrifice or payback, Paul will remove any doubt we have of David's claims.

Romans 4.1-8

Don't fear what others may think of your ugly confession. You won't be standing before them in the day of judgement.

1. Read Psalm 32 and 51. What stuck out to you from this verse or from the sermon on Sunday?

2. Do you confess your sin regularly? And to who? Why is it important to confess our sin to one another?

3. If confessing our sin brings healing, what happens when we don't confess our sins? Read Psalm 32:3-4

4. Psalm 32:9 talks about a horse/mule without understanding. Pastor Jobey explained this as a stubbornness in our confession. Can you think of a specific time when you have been too stubborn to confess? What was the outcome?

5. What is the difference between Admission and Confession?


6. If you have trouble confessing without deceit, what might your first confession look like?

7. Read Luke 18:9-14 and Matthew 6:7. Now compare the prayers of the Pharisee's with David's praver in Psalm 6:1-10. Are your pravers honest and messy like David's or are they more like the Pharisee's?

8. In your community groups pair up with someone to discuss your struggles and successes in confessing sin. Are your prayers more like David's or like the Pharisee's? Why? If you have sin that needs to be confessed, use this time to be honest with one another and God. Healing comes with confession. Encourage and pray for one another!
