### **IMAGE BEARERS**

# We become who we are not by looking inward, but by looking outward.

Paul tells us that we are becoming and will be conformed with what we look to and behold as beautiful and worthy of our adoration. Something we see as necessary for satisfaction. We are not originators of our own unique lives and personalities, but rather we have interpreted and responded to the many things that happen around us. Those choices shape our reflection.

We are 100% made to be reflections, we are not originators. Therefore, we must ask ourselves, what is it we are reflecting, and why? And also, what do we want to reflect?

Psalm 115.4-8

### **NEVER NEUTRAL**

As we read Paul's words in **Romans 12.1, 2**, we necessarily make the assumption that when he speaks of the "body" being presented, he is speaking not simply of the physical body, but everything that involves our body: thoughts, words, emotions, desires, habits, etc. We ought to be able to present *all* of those things to Him as holy and acceptable. So, though many things in life are inherently neutral (social media, entertainment, food, etc.), the heart, approach, and motivation we bring to them is never neutral.

Matthew 15.10, 11

### **RENEWING THE MIND**

Colossians 3.1-16

We need to be willing to put off old ways, habits, and liturgies, and put on new ones. We do this by fixing our eyes on, and beholding, the things that are above, not the things that are below.

John 15.4, 5

To have our minds renewed, we have to learn how to abide in the vine. God gives us three primary things that help us to be connected to His power and stay abiding in Him. These three key foundational "means of grace" are the Word, prayer, and Gospel community. God uses these things firstly to reveal our blind spots and the "water" of habits we swim in but don't see. Secondly, these things put on display a more worthy object of worship, our Savior, Jesus Christ. And thirdly, they point us to and connect us to the power of the Gospel so that we can truly change. Through this, we are renewed.


#### Your Life Mission
