2 Corinthians 3.16-18 // February 23, 2020

NOTES:

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Romans 12.1, 2 // 2 Corinthians 3.16-18, 4.6

Two words mentioned here share the word "form."

- Being transformed is the process
- Being conformed is the end result

To be transformed and conformed means to be "patterned after" or made into a "mold" of something or someone. The Greek word for "transformed" is metamorphoomai, which of course you can tell is where we get "metamorphosis." It is important to note that "being transformed" is passive, meaning it is something done to us, rather than something we do to ourselves.

BEING TRANSFORMED

Ezekiel 36.26, 27 // 2 Corinthians 5.17, 18 // Philippians 1.6

One of the most fantastic truths about our transformation is that we have become a new creation. And this means that not only have we been forgiven of our sin, but we also now have a new ability to put our sin to death.

There is a difference between reigning sin and surviving sin.

It is one thing for sin to live in us, it is another thing to live in sin.

BEING CONFORMED

Our goal and hope is not to be conformed to the image of morality, but to the image of Christ. It is one thing to do what is right because you *know* it is right, but it is a whole other thing to do what is right because you *love* what is right.

But to have this happen to us, we must be changed from the inside out. And the only power that is able to do this is the power of the Gospel. It is only by beholding and being amazed at what Christ has done for us on the cross that our hearts melt and are remade and remolded.


Your Life Mission
