THE SAVIOR OF THE WEAK

Matthew 12.15-21

LORD OF THE SABBATH

Conflict over the Sabbath was probably the second biggest confrontational topic between Jesus and the Pharisees, second only to His claim to be the Messiah. They had 39 extra categories of laws and regulations to keep the Sabbath, completely missing the point of the purpose of the Sabbath, which was to be a service and help to the Jews, not a burden.

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SERVANT OF GOD

Matthew quotes **Isaiah 43.1-3**, known as the Scripture about the "Suffering Servant." Here, Matthew draws from the Old Testament to show that Jesus has not come as a judgmental tyrant, but rather a suffering servant who came to heal the broken hearted and take the burden of sin. This is contrary to the kind of ministry the Pharisees were employing.

A BRUISED REED AND A SMOLDERING WICK

In a sermon on this Scripture, C.H. Spurgeon sees the bruised reed as someone who has just come under conviction and conversion for the first time; someone who finally sees their brokenness. He also sees the smoldering wick as a Christian who is at their wit's end, seemingly about to burn out. Not wanting to make too much delineation, he simply puts them together as a picture of believers who are weak and humbled.

Psalm 34.17-22

Both the bruised reed and the oak of righteousness are equally clothed in the same robe of Christ's righteousness, and both will equally share in His same victory.

Philippians 1.6 // Hebrews 6.13-20 // 2 Corinthians 12.8-10 // Hebrews 4.15, 16

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 12:15-21. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Read Psalms 34:17-22. According to C.H. Spurgeon, a "bruised reed" is a believer that is weak and humble. Why is a blessing when we are weak?

What burdens are you carrying that you need to give to Jesus? What weights you down? Is your past haunting you? Does your present suffocate you? Does your future scare you? Do you worry about your health failing you? Your sin entangling you?

Read Psalms 68:19, Psalms 55:22, 1 Peter 5:7 and Matthew 11:30. Where do you typically turn to when you are feel weak and burdened? Jesus? Or something else? Or both? And then answer, why do you not turn to Jesus if you believe that He can carry your burden?

Read Romans 3:23, 1 Peter 3:18, 1 Peter 2:24, 2 Corinthians 5:21 and Isaiah 53:3-7. It's good to know and believe that Jesus helps us carry our daily burdens. But the better news is that Jesus carried our ultimate burden when He carried our sin on His back and put it to death on the cross. He is our Suffering Servant who bore our sins on the tree. How does knowing and remembering the Gospel empower you when you're weak and over-burdened? Give an example of when you did that, and what resulted.

Read Ephesians 2:4-10. What does verse 6 say that God does with "us", His "bruised reed"?

Read Revelation 5:1-12. Remind yourself that both in Heaven and on earth Jesus, the "Lamb that was slain" as the Suffering Servant. Jesus is worshiped because He suffered. Then pray both in your personal time of "abiding" and together in Community Group with this verse in mind. When you pray, Preach this passage into your heart and into your mind! Next, confess and Repent of the sin of so often not giving your burden to the Lord. Ask God to help you cast your cares to Him instead of running to other false gods. Pray that as His "bruised reed", God would be glorified in your life. Last, end with Thanksgiving and Yield to His will.
