PALM SUNDAY: THE KING IS HERE!

TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

The "Triumphal Entry" occurs in all four Gospels:

Matthew 12.1-11 // Mark 11.1-11 // Luke 19.28-44 // John 12.12-19

Hosanna: This is a Greek word that comes from the Hebrew word "hoshiya na," which means "save now," "oh, save," or simply "salvation." Over time its meaning has evolved from a cry for future help, to a shout of confidence knowing that we have been/will be rescued.

Psalm 118.25

Donkey: A king who rode a donkey came to declare peace; a king who rode in on a horse came to declare war.

Ephesians 2.14-22

Palm Branches: These were a symbol of victory for Israel.

FALSE EXPECTATIONS

SAVE.

Jesus was sent to save. We have been saved to be sent. We are sent into our community to share the Good News that Christ came to save us, and we hope to see many who find new life.

EQUIP.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK
What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
First of all, let's do a little "Theology 101." The word "eschatology" means the "study of the end times." When speaking of "general eschatology," we look at how the end times unfold for the whole world. But when we speak of "personal eschatology," we look at what happens over the course of an individual's life. So what is your "personal eschatology"? If you are a believer, here is a basic map:
Physical Birth, but Dead in Sin >> Made Spiritually Alive by God's Sovereign Grace Opening Your Eyes >> Believe in Faith and Become Justified/Forgiven >> Struggling in Sin While Being Sanctified >> Physical Death >> Glorification in Heaven and Made Brand New >> Eternally Imperishable
With that in mind, read Romans 7.15-8.2. What does this tell you about your "personal eschatology?"
Now read Romans 8.28-39. What does this add to your personal eschatology, as far as what you can look forward to, both in this life as well as beyond?
Often times in life, the list of things in Romans 8.35 come upon us. Like the Jews on Palm Sunday, sometimes we expect that Christ has entered into our life to abolish all of those things. But by reading Romans 7.15-8.39, we see that we will still face these trials in this part of our personal eschatology. Read 2 Corinthians 2.14-3.3. How does enduring through the difficulties actually make this passage in 2 Corinthians even more powerful and sweet?
When you think of yourself as a "censer" or "vessel" that exudes the aroma of Christ, how does that affect the way you look at your daily life and purpose?
2 Corinthians 3.2, 3 depicts us as living epistles. How, specifically have you been a "living epistle," telling the story of Christ's victory and redemption of mankind?
Verse 2 says that our story (as the "letter") is to be "read by all." In what ways are you as a letter letting your story be told in and through your life?
Read Matthew 5.13-16. Jesus here tells the people to not hide their light. What are some reasons why you might hide your light?

Remember that in **2 Corinthians 2.14-16** we know that our "story" and "aroma" will be hated by many, so we shouldn't let that stop us or quiet us. Read **Luke 6.22, 23** and **John 15.18-21**. How does this give you comfort?
