Matthew 27.11-66

## THE TRIAL AND CRUCIFIXION OF JESUS

Matthew 27.11-66 // Isaiah 50.3, 53.3, 12 // Psalm 22.16, 18, 34.20 // Exodus 12.46

#### **Crucifixion Facts:**

- The criminal would be laid down and stretched out. 6-9 inch nails would be driven into the wrists, severing the median nerve, which would cause a severe burning and shooting pain and would paralyze the hand.
- This would minimize bleeding, causing a slow death, prolonging the suffering.
- Weight of the body would pull against the wrists, shoulders and elbows would dislocate out of the joints, the ligaments and tendons would tear.
- A footrest was placed under the feet to support them in order to also prolong the death. Also a seat to provide support and prolong suffering.
- The feet were either on top of each other or side by side each other and nailed through the footrest.
- Breathing becomes near impossible. The criminal would have to press down with his feet to take a breath. The nails would push against and tear the tissue between the metatarsals. The scourged back would rub on the cross.
- Air would come in, but not go out, causing carbon dioxide to stay in the body, which would lead to suffocation.
- The heart, under extreme pressure, would eventually burst.

## THE VEIL TORN IN TWO

Inside the Temple, there was a main hall called the Holy Place, but it was separated from the Most Holy Place, or the Holy of Holies. In the Holy of Holies is where the Ark of the Covenant, and the tangible presence of the Lord dwelled. Man could not be in the presence of God, which is why there was a separation by a veil. This veil was about 60 feet tall and 4 to 6 inches thick.

Why is this important? Because we need to understand that Christ did not *only* save us from death, but He saved us TO God!

# COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read through Matthew 27:11-56. What stood out to you the most from these verses or the message on Sunday?

Compare the reaction of the crowds in Matthew 21:8-11 and 27:21-23. (Read Mark 15:7 and Luke 23:18 for more background on Barabbas.) Why do you think the crowd wanted Jesus to be crucified, instead of the "notorious criminal," Barabbas? What did Jesus do that was so offensive to them?

Why do you think Pilate had some reservations with crucifying Christ? How did he show his hesitation? Do you feel any empathy for Pilate? Why or why not? Is Pilate especially guilty for Christ's death, or was he simply part of God's plan for redemption?

Why do you think Christ was crucified, rather than slain in some other manner? Read Numbers 21:7-9, Deuteronomy 21:22-23; and Galatians 3:13-14. Find some other prophetic Scriptures that were satisfied by Christ's death to share in your group. (Hint: check Isaiah and Psalms.)

Read Hebrews 9:1-14. What is the significance of the curtain of the temple being torn in two?

What emotions do you feel when you read through this passage of Scripture? How does reading through this passage impact how you feel about the Gospel? Read Romans 6:6 and Galatians 2:20.

This passage in Matthew 27.11-56 is hard to read. Christ is tortured, mocked, and ultimately put to death for, ironically, claiming to be the "King of the Jews," which He actually is. But we know this was all part of the Father's plan. Using the P.R.A.Y. model, spend some time preaching the Gospel to yourself, reminding yourself that through Christ's death, He puts to death our own sinful nature, and that through Christ's resurrection, we can be made alive in Him. Make a point to specifically spend some time preparing yourself for Good Friday and Easter Sunday this weekend.
