### LANGUAGE FOR WEAKNESS

#### Psalm 27

Where do we go and what do we ask for when we are in a time of great need, fear, and we don't know where to turn? David, here in Psalm 27, is being pursued by his enemies, and he calls upon God to be his shelter. He like others in the bible, such as Moses (Numbers 11.15), Asaph (Psalm 77), Jonah (Jonah 4.3), Job (Job 7.15), Elijah (1 Kings 19.4), Jeremiah (Jeremiah 20.14), and Paul (2 Corinthians 1.8), were in places so dark they even wanted death. These stories give us relatable ways to express our hearts and seek after the Lord.

### OUR WEAKNESS AS A PATH TO GOD'S STRENGTH

#### 2 Corinthians 12.7-10

Our church, and the world, needs the kind of men and women who are willing and able to be bold in the declarations of our faults. Not in a bragging or flippant or excusing way, but in a humble way. And when we are in that place, we can plead as David did to be saved from our enemies, but we also aim for something higher and better. Paul embraced his weakness "so that the power of Christ may rest upon me." David cried out to the Lord to "search my heart," "be my strength," "teach me Your way," "lead me on a level path," "let me dwell in Your presence."

### **GOD'S FAITHFULNESS**

We may be like Job, or Jonah, or Elijah on many days. But if we are like them, we also may know that God will be to us as He was to them. He was faithful to them, and to every single one of all of His children.

Romans 8.26-31 // Job 19.25-27 // Psalm 27.13, 14

## COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

1. Read **Psalm 27**. What stuck out to you from these set of verses or what did you take out of the sermon on Sunday?

**2.** When you look at **Psalm 27** and compare it to **Psalm 77** what differences do you notice? We noticed Psalm 77 starts with weakness and despair then turns to faith and praise, but what happens in 27?

**3.** In Jobey's sermon he talked about what our enemies might be (doubt, shame, health scares, etc.). What 'enemies' have you experienced and what are the most common that seem to present themselves? How do you most often respond to these enemies, and how should we respond?

**4.** In **Psalm 27** David calls out, but in **Psalm 77** Asaph did not have the strength to call out, but they both end up clinging to the promises of God. When you go through suffering, what do you cling to? Let's look at that Spurgeon quote once more: "Ordinary mourners sip at suffering's bowl. Christ drinks it dry." How does Christ's suffering help us when we face trials?


**5.** Read **Hebrews 6:13-20**. Have you ever made a promise that you did not fulfill? Without dropping names, has anyone failed to keep their promises to you? Look at verse 19. Where do you often place your hope? Promises of our own? Promises of others?

6. Lastly, read Romans 8.26-39. What similar themes and parallels do you see in Psalm 27 with this passage?

Spend time as a group praying in the P.R.A.Y. model, which is modeled after the Lord's Prayer. Share with the group situations in your life that you need to be able to have honest and real prayer for.
