

Psalm 107

LET THE REDEEMED OF THE LORD SAY SO

It is easy to forget where God has brought us from. Here in Psalm 107, it says that if we recognize that God's steadfast love has been good to us, we should recall that and say so. Giving thanks is a necessary discipline that we must do continually in order to remind ourselves when we have "selective memory" concerning God's faithfulness.

Psalm 107

This psalm describes four different types of circumstances that people get into, and what they did in the midst of it. More importantly, it tells us what God's response was.

1. Wandering Empty and Apart from God and His People: vs. 4-9

This person is one that has been wandering through life, finding nowhere to settle. Or maybe they are like Goldilocks, they look and look but can't find something that quite formed enough to their image. This person can't find a "city to dwell in." Ultimately, this "city" speaks of Christ, but also as the people of God, as Zion is the City of God that represents God unified with His people. This person wanders and is hungry and thirsty.

2. Rebellion that Brings Isolation: vs. 10-16

This person has become a prisoner of their own sin. They willfully rebel against God's Word, and went against His Wisdom. God, in turn, brings about consequences that were difficult, so much so, that they were left in isolation.

3. Sin Brought Suffering and Near Death: vs. 17-22

Similar to the previous person, this one had their sin take them further than they planned, and they even suffered physical and tangible affliction. They couldn't even eat, maybe because sickness or just loss of appetite, and even were brought near to death. Sometimes, our sin has actual health consequences, like addictions, some diseases like STD's, etc.

4. Storms of Life: vs. 23-32

This person was going about life, doing business, maybe providing for a family, but all of this was done in their own strength. God brought about a storm, and it devastated their life. Everything was gone, and it was out of their control, and not necessarily because of sin. They came to their wit's end, as their own abilities had dried up.

MANY STORIES, ONE SOLUTION

Though there are many circumstances, there is one solution: cry out to God.

1 Corinthians 6.9-11 // John 6.35-40 // Isaiah 41.10 Psalm 91.14-16 // 2 Corinthians 1.19-22

Since God has sworn to Himself that He will fulfill His covenant, we can be convinced that He will always be with us. And with that promise comes a command at the end of each of these four people's stories: "Let them thank the Lord for His steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man!"

Psalm 107.8-9, 15-16, 21-22, 31-32, 1-3

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK


Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

- 1. Read Psalm 107. What was interesting, encouraging, or stuck out to you from the verses or from the sermon on Sunday?
- 2. Read Psalm 107:1-3 again. Then read Psalm 100:5, Psalm 103:1-8, and Lamentations 3:22-24. Do you believe that the Lord's love endures for you forever? Do you put your hope in the Lord to bring you a good future? If not who or what?
- 3. How might you honestly complete this sentence: "my future will be good if I have..."
- 4. There were four different types of people represented in Psalm 107. Which do you relate to the most? Why?
- 5. In verse 2 of Psalm 107 it says, "Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom He has redeemed from trouble." Describe a time the Lord has redeemed you. Have a few people in your group share a short (3-5 mins) story of how God has done this.
- 6. Spend some time (around 20-30 mins) breaking up into smaller groups to confess and repent of any sin. Keep in mind that God already knows your heart and you don't get a badge for pretending to have it all together (Psalm 147:10-11), and we don't need to fear what men think (Psalm 118:6).

End group together in prayer. Using the P.R.A.Y. model. Praising God for the gift of His word, Repenting of the sin just confessed. Asking God to redeem you with his love and mercy, then Yielding with Thanksgiving.
