1 Peter 3.8-22, 4.12-19

DON'T FIGHT FIRE WITH FIRE: VERSES 8-16

Peter reiterates that we should endure and expect suffering, and that our response should come from the example given by Christ.

IS SUFFERING GOD'S WILL?: VERSES 3.17 AND 4.12-19

The Word promises us that we will suffer for righteousness' sake. It is not for us to loathe situations or people and become bitter, but rather to look to Christ as our example and "consider it joy" when we suffer for His sake, looking to the future hope of glory.

It is a miserable existence for a believer to think that *in this life* they will get all that Christ purchased on the cross.

When we are waiting for vindication, comfort, the easy life, the material blessing, the healing, the ideal life, so that *then we can be happy and have joy*, we will simply waste our life on worry, sorrow, regret, self-centeredness, bitterness, and anger, towards others, ourselves, and God.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
Read 1 Peter 3.8-17 and 4.12-19. What words or thoughts through these first few verses jump out at you?
Have you ever been told, or told someone, "God blesses obedience" or "God will honor it if you do the right thing" when they are faced with a difficult situation? Let's think a little critically about these phrases. Though not <i>entirely</i> false, what do they set us up to expect?
God does indeed bless obedience, but oftentimes what our words are laced with is "it'll work out in your favor and you want it to." And that part is simply not true. God's blessing you for your obedience may be the blessing of suffering or persecution, not alleviation or vindication. How can suffering or persecution be a blessing?
Read Romans 5.1-5. What does suffering produce in our lives, and how does that give us more confidence?
Suffering reveals what you worship. When we endure suffering, if we are truly believers it will, even if painfully, bring us closer to Christ. If our hope is not in Christ, we will run to other things. Suffering builds confidence in Christ because it produces more evidence and fruit of your salvation, which turns into a greater amount of faith that you then live out. Having the right perspective on suffering wrongfully is critical for us to know that we can run to Christ and trust in Him.
Read these Proverbs: 10.9, 17, 11.3, 12.1, 17, 18, 13.13, 15.1, 17.13, 17.27, 20.19, 22.5, 24, 25, 24.17, 18, 29, 25.21, 22, 28, 26.24-26, 27.5, 6. That's a big of list of proverbs. What comfort or peace can you take from them as you think through your own temptations to seek out justice and retribution in "unfair" circumstances in your life?
I often say that it's one thing to agree with the truth, it's another thing to live it out. How can you effectively "live out" these truths so that your temptation doesn't draw you into a sinful response?
On a piece of paper, think through the "unfair" or "unjust" suffering you have or are enduring, and write out what you feel like you are "owed" so that you can "move on." Then, below it, write out why Christ's payment on the cross for their sins is not enough. If that line is blank, you are in good shapenow it's time to give thanks to Christ for what He has done, repent of bitterness, ask Him for restoration

and humility in your heart, and yield to His work in your life.
