MEDITATING ON GOD'S WORD

What is Biblical meditation?

- First, it is not daydreaming, not mystical religious experience.
- Instead, it is spending quiet time thinking, pondering, dwelling on God's Word, into our minds and pleading that it will sink down to our hearts.
- When we meditate on the Word of God, who God is, what He has done and who
 we are in Him, then we are a JoyFULL people.
- Biblical Meditation is the middle ground between studying and praying. It's the bridge between the two.

THINK OUT YOUR THEOLOGY

 - o About the church, or life in the people of God?
- Memorize scripture

Some of the things we can meditate on are:

- God's Word (Ps 119:15-16, Ps 1:13, Ps 119:48, Ps 119:99)
- The Works of God (Ps 77:12, Ps 111:2, Ps 143:5, Ps 145:5)
- God's Creation (Ps 8:19, Ps 104:134, Matthew 6:26-30)

Choose one or two areas of meditation that you'd like to focus on and read the corresponding verses. Share some of the verses that encouraged you or challenged you that you can reflect and meditate on during the week.

Read Psalm 1:2 again. Psalm 119:11, Psalm 119:55, Psalm 119:27, Psalm 119:97-98 | Psalm 48:9-10, Psalm 63:56, Joshua 1:8, Psalm 119:15-16, **Psalm 16:8.** What are the results of Biblical Meditation?

How can meditating on God, His word, His works, and His creation, help promote joy and awe in your life?

End group by praying together that you can be obedient in this area of vour walk with God.
