PALM SUNDAY

Psalm 118.19-29

SALVATION IS NEAR

For about three years, Jesus was ministering on the earth. In this final week of His earthly life, He is entering into Jerusalem. Psalm 118 is one of the "Hallel Psalms (113-118) that were sung particularly during Passover. This one was sung when Jesus was entering into Jerusalem as they waved palm branches.

Luke 19.29-35 // Matthew 21.8, 9 // Zechariah 9.9

Christ came to put on full and graphic display the glory of God's goodness and holiness by becoming the sacrifice needed to save sinners.

Psalm 23.3, 79.9, 106.8 // Jeremiah 14.7 // 1 John 2.12

God's glory is at the center of this plan, not us. We are the beneficiaries, but we are not the center. Christ came because God is good, and the best way to put God's goodness and holiness and love and beauty was *not* a display of military force, destroying the earth, or swift and immediate judgement, but rather by sacrificing Himself and stand in the place of His own enemies while receiving the righteous judgement of God.

THE PSALMS BRING US TO JESUS

The Psalms ultimately don't simply lead us and teach us how to pray, but they show us who God is and show us how (and why) we can go to Him. He is a personal God who is not distant, but came near.

Psalm 67 // 1 Peter 2.4-10

Jesus came to us that we may be blessed with forgiveness, grace, mercy and love. But He did this so that we might glorify the Father. Though we reject Him in our sin, He made a way for us and became the Cornerstone for us to be built on.

Jesus blesses us and then gives us the command to "go and tell," "proclaim," "make disciples," be "ministers of reconciliation" and "ambassadors for Christ."

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read Psalm 118:19-29 what stuck out to you from these set of verses or from the message Sunday?

Take a look at Isaiah 28:16 and 1 Corinthians 1:22-25. What is Christ to the believer and what is Christ to the non-believers?

The Jews though Jesus was coming to establish a physical kingdom and missed the point that He came to establish a spiritual kingdom. When is a time in your life that you thought God would save you from a certain situation or fix a certain problem, and He didn't? What did that do to your faith?

Read 1 Corinthians 3:11-13. God's promises will always remain and the foundation with which was built by the cross of Christ will never be moved, but how we live our lives will be tested. Read 1 Peter 1:6-9. The things of this world will be destroyed and are ever fading, but that which remains is a faith built on Christ. Does this give you hope? How should this change the way we live our lives and serve one another?

Now think of times when God has saved you from circumstances, spared you, brought you through a problem, or even simply shows you mercy and grace by giving you many "small" gifts like your job, family, and friends. How did that affect your faith? Did you just receive them and more or less take it for granted, maybe with a quick, "thanks, God!" and skip away, or did it actually change the way you pursue God in the way that you use it for His glory?

Read **Psalm 67.** What is the reason God blesses us in His many ways? How are you using those blessings for His glory?

Look at Psalm 118:28-29 again. Because our hope can never be shaken or moved, this should cause our hearts to sing. But we live in a fallen world and it is hard to remember or we get distracted. How do you forget? What distracts you from the glorious Truth that cannot be move? Spend some time encouraging one another towards the Gospel.
