JESUS, SENT TO SAVE

Easter Sunday 2017

WHY ARE YOU HERE?

In the days following Jesus rising from the grave, He appeared to His disciples on multiple occasions to prove that He had indeed conquered death. On one occasion, He found Peter, who had previously professed an undying commitment to Jesus, and then later denied Him publicly, where He found him the first time they met: gone fishing.

John 21.1-14

It doesn't seem that Peter had given up his faith, but it is interesting we find him going about life, doing what he does. There was probably a lot of soul-searching going on in Peter's life. Today, we can ask ourselves, "why am I here?" "Why am I not at home, doing whatever I want to do?"

AN HONEST CONVERSATION WITH JESUS

Here in this interaction with Jesus, He asks Peter a simple question, but the answer Peter gives is not so simple. When Jesus asks, "do you love me," He uses a word for "love" that means "unconditional love." But Peter responds with a different word for "love," a word that means "like/love as a friend." He is honest, but it doesn't deter Jesus.

We don't' come to Jesus *once* we clean up the mess of our life. We come to Jesus *because* we have made a mess of life.

THE BAD NEWS...AND THE GOOD NEWS

Romans 3.23 // Isaiah 59.2

The bad news is, like Peter, we've all fallen short, even of our own standards, let alone God's standards. Our sin, like a jail cell, has separated us from God. But the Good News is that God, because of His great love, created a solution.

John 3.16-18, 6.37-40, 14.6

We have been separated from God; Christ was sent to bridge the gap.

As if that wasn't enough, Christ comes into our life as well to heal broken hearts, bring hope to the hopeless, and comfort, peace, and guidance to those who are going through the many challenges of life. At our church, we've come to know this, and we are here to help each other, and we would love to be able to help you as well.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read John 21.1-14 what stuck out to you from this set of verses or from the message Sunday?

Peter's story is fascinating, and such a great reminder for us. We can safely assume that after Peter's denial of Jesus three times, and then seeing Christ resurrected, he must have been contemplating much about his life. On Sunday, Jobey asked the question, "why are you here?," asking specifically about Easter Sunday (and Sunday gatherings in general). How would you answer that question? Why do you gather with others on Sundays?

Peter had work to do, and probably even had some shame he was living in. What kinds of things keep you (or tempt you) from being around a community of people who can help you grow and point you to Jesus?

Read John 21.15-19 again. The word for "love" that Jesus used was "agape," which means "unconditional love." When asked if Peter loved (agaped) Jesus, Peter said, "Yes, I love you," but answered with a different word for love, the word "phileo," which is more of a brotherly or friendship type love, a lesser love than agape. Think about yourself and put yourself in Peter's shoes. How would you respond to Jesus' question, and how would you feel when He asked?

How does Jesus' response encourage you and relieve you?

Jesus' final words to Peter in this passage began with Him telling Peter that there was a time when Peter could do whatever he wanted, but in the future, He essentially tells Peter that his future would be for God's glory. Read Ephesians 2.1-10. How does the natural evolution from "dead" to "alive" finally culminate in verse 10? What is the fruit or result of this death to life progression?

Jesus ends by saying "follow me." On Sunday, Jobey talked about next steps for everyone: believers, non-believers, connected and unconnected. What is a "next step" you need to be taking to answer the question, "what are you doing here," as it pertains to your life in this world?
