Jonah 1.1-3

BACKGROUND

2 Kings 14.23-27

The book of Jonah chronicles events that took place sometime in the 8th century BC. During this time, Israel was being ran by Jeroboam II, who did evil in the sight of the Lord. Jonah was a prophet, brought up in the ways of Elijah and Elisha.

Ninevah was the capital of Assyria, and a treacherous place filled with pagan Gentiles. It lies in the heart of the city of Mosul in modern day Iraq. Despite Jonah's past glory as a follower of God, his resume did nothing for him to bring about present obedience.

Pursuing a God-centered life will not make your struggles easier,
It will make your struggles harder.

The more we are called to God-centered living, the more we realize the problem is not our circumstances, or the people around us, but the problem is inside of us. And yet when we are faced with our own sin, we easily will justify it or blame other things or people, or we will minimize it and compare it to other people's sin. Additionally, we will always be looking to *past obedience* and wanting to get credit for that to apply toward today's sin.

No past privilege, nor all past privileges together, no past obedience, nor fruitfulness of service, can ever substitute for present obedience to the Word of God.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read Jonah 1:1-3. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Who was Jonah? What was his background? Does a bright past necessarily preclude a bright present? Jonah's background was full of godly influence. What things in your past make up your highlight reel? How does this reflect where you are today? _

Are there areas in your life where you are taking God out of the center and putting yourself there? Even only for a season? Explain.

Has there been a time in your life where God has called you to do something, but instead of obeying you ran the other way? What was it, and if you have done this, how should you have responded?

Jonah was unwilling to follow God at this point. There was idolatry in his heart, something more important to him than God's call on his life. No doubt, he either hid this or ran from godly counselors in his life. Read Galatians 2:20 and Proverbs 27.5, 6. Our life is not our own, but is there a certain thing in your life that is off limits for discussion with others? If yes, why? Do you struggle with inviting others to speak into your life?

On Sunday Pastor Jobey asked a few questions at the end of his sermon. Spend some time going through the questions as a group:

- Would you say that you are willing to follow God no matter what?
- In the past week, how have you focused on yourself and put yourself at the center?
- When was the last time you became anary, or the last time you ran from God or God's people in order to get away?
