JONAH IS ON THE RUN

Jonah is on the run. He knows what he is to do, but he does the opposite. His previous job was to live among God's people and prophesy of God's faithfulness, blessings, and promises. Now God was calling him to God's enemies to prophesy destruction! He was filled with fear and unwilling to trust.

Nahum 3.1

Jonah "finds" a boat going to Tarshish. He knows he can't get away from the Lord, but he wants to get away from His calling and His people.

Anonymity and isolation is a friend to those who have something to hide.

HIDING FROM GOD

Activity is a poor substitute for obedience.

We can very easily make spiritual activity look like we are being or doing godly things. We can look good, fool people, and even fool ourselves, but we cannot fool God. Martin Luther said, concerning Jonah, that "the ship, and even the whole world, was too small for Jonah to hide in."

Psalm 139.7-8 // Jonah 1.1, 6

Be ready, because there will *always* be a ship in the harbor waiting to take you elsewhere.

JESUS, THE GREATER JONAH

Picture this...God says to Jonah, "Arise from your place of comfort, your home, and go to the wicked people so they may be saved." Jonah says "no."

God says to His own Son, "Arise from Your place of comfort, Your home, and go to the wicked people so they may be saved." Jesus says "yes."

- By one man's sacrificial death, a storm saved a ship full of pagans.
- In this story, it was the sins of the man himself,
- But in the Gospel story, it is the actual sins of the world.
- But notice also that Jonah doesn't commit suicide.
- He is put to death, yet willfully.

You and I, like Jonah, say no. But Jesus said yes. And it is the yes of Jesus that saves us.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read **Jonah 1:1-17**. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

On Sunday Jobey talked about Jonah setting up boundaries in his heart. Think about and share with your group boundaries that the Lord has revealed in your heart or boundaries you have previously overcome.

Jonah wanted to get away, to be on his own and isolate himself from the people in His life. Are there times in your life where you feel the desire to be isolated or a time when you were isolated? Why? What was that season like or what brought you back to community? Explain.

When it comes to disobedience, the sermon mentioned how exhausting it can be. But obedience can be exhausting too. From what we know, Jonah seemed to live an obedient life, but wanted to get away and drop all responsibility. **Read 1 Peter 5:10 and Isaiah 40:30-31.** Do you think Jonah forgot where his strength comes from? Do you forget where your strength comes from?

Jonah ran from the call of God, but Jesus ran towards the call of God. Thankfully we are not saved by Jonah. Thankfully we are not save by ourselves. We are saved by the blood of the lamb, the one who imputes His perfect obedience on us. **Read Ephesians 2:8-9**

Take some time in your groups to remind each other of the fallen tendencies we all battle and the good news of the Gospel "that He who knew no sin, became sin that we might become the righteousness of God." **P.R.A.Y.** as a group that the Lord would reveal to you people in your life that look a lot like Jonah (other than yourself) and how you can reach out with kindness, compassion and humility knowing that it is God who saves.
