## STEWARDS OF OUR LIVES

1 Corinthians 4.1-8

### SERVANTS AND STEWARDS

The Corinthians had an out of balance, celebrity view of their leaders. Paul tells them, "here is how you should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God."

**Servants:** This isn't the word Paul usually uses for "servant." This one seems to denote a lower servant, even someone called an "under-rower," the person who would be in the lower hull of a ship rowing.

**Stewards:** Stewards aren't owners, but caretakers. They are to be faithful with what is entrusted to them, taking care for their Master.

Hebrews 13.17

### WHAT THIS MEANS FOR EVERY CHRISTIAN

Because it is God who judges, and because we are just stewards, we should be careful about our judgment of our leaders, but also upon everyone in our lives. Paul says that they are practicing what they preach to be an example to them of not going beyond Scripture, imposing preferences and wrongful expectations upon people.

The Corinthians had an attitude that they were already know-it-alls who had what they needed, while these spiritual leaders were laboring and toiling for them. And so he asks three reflective questions:

- 1. Who sees anything different in you? (How are you any different than us?)
- 2. What do you have that you didn't receive?
- 3. If you received it, why do you boast as if you didn't receive it?

These questions, answered correctly, should humble us towards both our leaders and every other person we encounter in our lives.

### WE MUST BE FAITHFUL STEWARDS OF EVERYTHING

We often hear the word "stewardship" and think of money or time right off the bat. But *everything* we have has been given to us to take care of properly and faithfully. A steward is to be found as *faithful*. However, we act like many things are things we are entitled to, like our rights, comfort, happiness, opinions, preferences, choice of friends and social circles, etc.

When we get angry it's us saying "God, I deserve a better life than the one You've given me."

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## COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read 1 Corinthians 4.1-8. What stands out to you in this passage, and what stuck out to you most from the sermon on Sunday?

How does Paul describe what Apostles/Pastors/Leaders should be like? How is that in contrast with what the Corinthians were doing?

#### Preaching the Gospel to Yourself

There are some implicit and important elements that point us to the Gospel in this passage. Say you are tempted to judge or question a friend, pastor, or church on a matter that isn't explicitly wrong or sinful. What truths here can you bring to mind that connect you to the Gospel? (Hint: verses 5-7; Matthew 18.21-35 for more).

#### Repent and Confess

Have you gone "beyond what is written" in expecting certain standards from others? Have you judged quickly when you observe someone's decisions? Spouses, friends, pastors, churches, bosses...you name it, we like to pre-judge and do it quickly, often with very little information. What could you confess and repent of that you hope to grow in?

#### Ask for Provision

In light of this passage and the above confession, what might you ask for from God? Wisdom, patience, discernment, and slow speech? Could you also be in need of trusting God's sovereignty and His appointment of the spiritual leaders He has called to shepherd the flock? Or humility to listen to others who speak into your life? Or the perspective to become a sacrificial and faithful "under-rower" and steward? Read Hebrews 13.17. What benefit do you (and the church) get when you take heed to this passage?

#### Your Life Mission

As "under-rowers" and stewards, God has placed us in and around the lives of many people who are currently cut off from Him. How might you become an under-rower in their life as you aim to faithfully steward these God-aiven relationships? What conversations or encounters are upcoming that you could use prayer for?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Make sure to end your time of prayer Yielding with Thanksgiving for God's sovereignty and plan for your life.
