THE MEANINGLESS LIFE

Ecclesiastes 1.1-18 // April 28, 2019

AN INTRODUCTION

- Author: Officially anonymous, most likely King Solomon, David's son and heir to the throne after him. Many descriptions of his life match that of Solomon's.
 1 Kings 4.29-34, also see 11.1-25)
- Date: Somewhere around 935 BC.
- Theme: Reflections on life after living every way possible, and considering the end result and futility of it.

The Preacher begins with a dismal view of life, and admits that having this deeper insight does not change anything (v. 15) and actually can make you more sorrowful (v. 18). To read these thoughts in God's Word can be challenging, but this style of writing is meant to challenge and deepen our wisdom.

Theology is like wrestling an octopus.

Just when you think you have all the tentacles under control, there is one waving at you in the air.

THE FLEETING NATURE OF LIFE

- Vanity: Mentioned 38 times; means vapor, breath, breeze. *Not necessarily,* but often means empty arrogance and meaninglessness.
- Wisdom: Mentioned 53 times, 23 just in this first section.
- Death: Mentioned 21 times.
- Under the Sun: Mentioned 33 times. A phrase used to describe physical life
 as we see and experience it. God, however, does not exist and function solely
 "under the sun," but His ways and thoughts are above.

Despite the shocking subject matter, this writing is not meant to depress. It is meant to be read or listened to in one sitting, like a sermon, and given the whole scope, it aims to give us the right perspective.

MAKING THE MEANINGLESS MEANINGFUL

All of what the Preacher writes about our human existence is true for every single on of us. Except for Jesus.

Ecclesiastes 12.13, 14 // 1 Corinthians 16.58

Our work under the sun is empty and meaningless. Our work unto and through the Son is rich and meaningful.

Michael Eaton: Ecclesiastes defends the life of faith in a generous God by pointing to the grimness of the alternative.

Jeff Meyers: True wisdom is to fear God and keep his commandments, to receive and use the gifts of God with joy and gratitude.

Sid Greidanus: Fear God in order to turn a vain empty life into a meaningful life which will enjoy God's gifts.


Your Life Mission

However, when our lives are lived in light of God, and lived unto God, those same things have great meaning, eternal consequence, and give us great reason for joy and celebration. What mundane or "ordinary" parts of life might God want you to consider being more diligent in using for Him?

What conversations or social settings with non-believers are coming up that you could use prayer for? Or which people in your life do you think you should reach out to for coffee or to hang out? How can your group be praying for the people in your life that you love and care for?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love. Make sure to end your time of prayer Yielding with Thanksaiving for God's sovereignty and plan for your life.
