JESUS THE BAPTIST John 1.14-34 // May 10, 2020

NOTES:

BREAKING THE SILENCE

Malachi 4.5, 6 // Deuteronomy 18.18 // Isaiah 40.3-5

It had been 400 years since Israel had a prophet declaring the truth of God. And now, an eccentric man named John was speaking as if he himself was a prophet of God. John was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth of the Judean Hill Country. His mother was the cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus. It was foretold to Elizabeth that John would be the forerunner in the spirit of Elijah to prepare a path for the Messiah.

BAPTIZING IN THE SPIRIT

John's Gospel kicks off with an explosion of declaration, quickly followed by this story that focuses in on not just the baptism of Jesus, but on the baptism that Jesus brings. As John's baptism is merely symbolic, the baptism of Jesus is something that only Jesus can do. He immerses His people in the Holy Spirit. He fills them and seals them. This is the ministry He came to do.

Isaiah 11.1, 2 // Luke 4.18-21 // Joel 2.28, 29 1 Corinthians 12.12, 13 // John 7.38, 39

The Holy Spirit is given not just to flow into us, But also to flow out from us.

CARRYING ON

As we are immersed by Christ into the Holy Spirit, we begin to overflow. Our words become words of life, our actions become deeds of righteous witness and service. And yet, there are times when we look at our lives and don't see this kind of evidence. But we also have the great promise that He is indeed the Promise. The Spirit's role is to seal us, guarantee us, teach us, bring remembrance of truth to us, and bear witness of Jesus to us.

Ephesians 1.13, 14 // John 14.26, 15.26 1 Corinthians 12.3 // Matthew 28.18-20

We who have been baptized are now, by the authority given by Jesus the baptizer, to go, therefore, and baptize others.


Repent and Ask for Provision


