Confession: Recognizing fault and error and admitting sin first to God, then to others. There is total responsibility, no blaming, no justifying. "I'm sorry, but…" is not a true confession or apology. That's true justification with false confession.

Repentance: The hopeful follow up actions and efforts of change that should accompany true confession and recognition of sin. It is doing everything necessary to clear yourself of that action, habit, or attitude. **2 Corinthians 7**

GETTING TO THE HEART

James 1.14, 15

How to Probe for Unconfessed Sin: The easiest place to start is with known sin. Known sin is often the *fruit* of a more deeply embedded *root*. When we identify sin, we must not excuse it. When we excuse it, we allow it to live another day.

Questions to Ask: "Why did I just say that?" "Where is this coming from?" "Why do I have the desire to brag or 'one-up' somebody?" "Why do I put that person down?" "Why do I want to gossip?" "Why am I bitter?"

** The Key Is...do NOT let the answer start with, "because he/she/it..."

A proper assessment is critical, because what is at stake is your joy and God's glory.

THE JOYFUL ROAD OF REPENTANCE

Once we recognize and confess sin, we are ready to begin persevering on the joyful road of repentance. This begins with confessing to others and entrusting ourselves to the care of our Savior. As we remind ourselves of His love toward us, our partnership with His people will bring about the heart change and deepened strength of the power of the Gospel to enable us to "put off" the deeds of the flesh and "put on" the works of the Spirit.

Before you begin, have people in your group share this week's memory verse with each other

Read Psalm 32:1-11. What stuck out to you in these verses or what was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Do you believe this truth from Psalm 32:1-2? Will confession of sin really make us happier? And if so, what prevents us from doing it?

Do you have an example of a time that confessing sin actually lifted a burden or brought about joy like this Psalm says?

Look over again at Psalm 32:3,4,10. Now read 1 Corinthians 11:27-32. What is the outcome with unconfessed sin? According to verse 32, why does the Lord discipline us in this?

Read James 5:16 and Hebrews 3:12-13. How can we be restored and guard ourselves and others from falling back into the deceitfulness of sin?

How can confession and repentance of sin help promote joy and gwe in your life?

Read Romans 6:12-14. As chosen children who have been brought from death to life, God tells us to present ourselves to him as instruments for righteousness. Are you allowing sin to reign in your body? Are there areas of life that you see that you are not being proactive in the war against sin? How is your battle against these common sin areas?

SIN (FRUIT): Actions Words and Thoughts Ways You are Not Like Christ	Be specific in listing out the varying sins that have come to fruition.	
DEATH (RESULT): Consequences of Your Sin Shattered Aspects of Life	What has resulted in your life due to your sin? What has been wrecked because of your sin?	
RESTORATION: Who Have You Sinned Against?	Who have you sinned against, and in what ways? Be specific with specific instances. What do you need to ask forgiveness for?
