THE SIGN OF JONAH

Matthew 12.38-41

Jesus says that Jonah is the sign that will be given to the people. It seems that the man, Jonah himself, will be an example of a Hebrew who is sacrificed so that others can be saved. The power of God will be shown in the weakest part of Jonah's life, and God will raise him up to save others.

As one Hebrew was sacrificed for his sin to save others, a Greater Hebrew will become sin to save others.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD

Jonah had a simple message for the Ninevites. And it seems that Jonah probably told his personal story, since Jonah himself was the sign.

The greatest miracle of the story of Jonah is not the sending of the great fish, but the repenting of the hardened heart.

Jonah knew God's Word before, but now he has been affected by the power of God's Word.

If the Word does not dwell with power in us, It will not pass with power from us.

GOD'S STORY AND POWER IN OUR STORY AND WEAKNESS

Romans 1.16, 10.8-17

How will the "sign of Jonah" be seen today? Obviously, it is the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, the Greater Jonah, who was sent to die for His enemies. But how would this world know the "sign of Jonah?" We, too, in being like our Savior, must also model the "sign of Jonah." We, as jars of clay who are weak, sinful, and stubborn people like Jonah, must learn to carry in our body the death of Christ. We must die to ourselves, and be willing to be thrown overboard, so that others can HEAR the message of the greater Jonah.

We must be the messenger who did not just hear about it, but who have also witnessed it.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read Jonah 3:1-10. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?_

Pastor Jobey talked about how fear manifests itself into a desire to be in control. What areas of your life do you try to control the most? What root of fear is driving this need for control?

What was it that caused the Ninevites to repent from their sin? Read Hebrews 4:12. Do you believe God's Word is enough to change hearts, or do you tend to rely on your own devices to try and change others or yourself?

Read Matthew 12:38-41. What does Jesus say is the sign of the Prophet Jonah? Why will the men of Jonah condemn Jesus's generation at the Judgement? How do the words of Jesus in these verses show the power by which salvation occurs?

Jonah never wanted to go to Nineveh. But through his suffering his heart changed and he learned to be obedient. Read Hebrews 5:7. Jesus also learned obedience through what he suffered. Can you think of a time when God taught you obedience and changed your heart through something you suffered?

The miracle is not the _____, the miracle is the _ How could Jonah's message have been different had he gone to Nineveh at God's first invitation? How can our own experience with sin make us more compassionate in our sharing of the word with others?

Read Romans 10:8-17 and 2 Corinthians 4:7-10. How do we model the sign of Jonah? Where does faith originate? The cross of Christ makes us a light to the unsaved world. Their salvation comes from the hearing of God's word. How can they hear if we do not tell them?
