WHAT WILL HEAVEN BE LIKE?


- What does the bible say?

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
What was your picture of heaven growing up?
After looking at what the Word tells us, how has your view of heaven changed?
Looking over the extra handout from Sunday, what are the most surprising things to you about what the Word says about heaven?
Read Colossians 3.1-4. Why is it so important to think about heaven? How can thinking about heaven affect your daily life?
Why do you think Paul places the topic of heaven in between verses about killing sin and verses about everything working out for us because there is nothing that can come between us and God?
Paul seems to remind the church about heaven in order to give them that "boost" to continue to run (2 Timothy 4.6-8). Read Romans 8.5-17. How does Paul's transition from telling us that there is no condemnation for us (v. 1) and that Christ will resurrect our current body (v. 11) into him saying, "so then" in verse 12 show us that the fact that we are able to put to death our sin (v. 13)?
Why does he then, after talking about killing sin by way of a reminder that we are to be conquering sons, not fearful slaves (v. 14-17), continue by telling us about our future glory on the New Earth (v. 18-25?).
How often do you think of heaven, and what do you think about when you do?
After speaking of heaven briefly, Paul continues by writing down some of his most quoted verses. Read Romans 8.28-39. We often read all or part of these verses in church or as verses we memorize. How does the context of it following Paul's explanation of no condemnation, killing sin, adoption, and our future on the New Earth paint a more powerful picture of these incredible promises?
Read Hebrews 11.16 . Here it says that we should desire a better, heavenly

Read **Hebrews 11.16**. Here it says that we should desire a better, heavenly country. If your desire for heaven isn't that strong, in part because you don't know what to expect, pray that God would give you a deeper desire for it, and ask him to help your imagination to be guided by His Word, promises, and character.
