THE BREAD THAT SATISFIES AND SUSTAINS

Matthew 14.13-36

JESUS FEEDS THE 5,000 AND WALKS ON WATER

Continuing the shift in Matthew's Gospel of seeing the disciples be more prominent in the storyline, Jesus now performs a miracle that He invites them to partake in. They get a deepened picture of His divine ability to provide, so much so that the people (shown in **John 6**) wanted to crown Him as King. But despite this, the people, as well as the disciples, still seemed to not see the big picture.

John 6.1-40

Again we see Jesus demonstrating His power and authority, but this "follow up" miracle to the feeding of the 5,000 serves an even more specific purpose. In the story of the food, the people miss the point that not only does Jesus provide bread, but that He IS the Bread. Here, in this story, Jesus shows the disciples more clearly it is not bread that saves, but it is He that saves.

Beyond that, even, Jesus calls them again into ministry with Him. In the first, He says, "you give them bread." Here, He calls Peter to step out of the boat. He goes beyond showing them His authority by actually calling them to trust Him in His authority.

Jesus doesn't just give what satisfies, He *is* what satisfies.

JESUS' COMMANDS FOR US

Two other similarities in these two stories are that Jesus commands His disciples to do things that they have no power to do: give the people bread, and come out and walk on water.

Philippians 4.13

HOW DO WE TRUST HIM MORE DEEPLY?

The very next day, we see in **John 6.22-35** that Jesus tells His followers what they must do to do the work of God. His answer is alarming. He says it is to "believe in Him." As we put our faith and trust in Jesus as the One who doesn't just satisfy, but IS our satisfaction, our hearts, minds, and lives are changed.

Psalm 37.4, 5

Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read **Matthew 14.13-33**. What stuck out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Re-read **verse 14**, then read **Colossians 3:12** and **2 Corinthians 1:3-4**. If you were one of the disciples with Jesus, what would you take away from this story? What lesson(s) would you have learned about Jesus here?

In **Numbers 14.1-12** the Israelites complain to their mediator Moses about not having enough food. God's people are so uncomfortable that they actually want and are desiring their "old life" of slavery from Egypt instead of their new life of freedom with God. When you are in need of comfort, rest or pleasure where *do* you turn and WHY? What "saves" you in your moment of need? Is what you turn to helping you?

Now read **1 Peter 5.6, 7, Psalms 27.4, 5** and **Matthew 6.25-33**. When you are in need of comfort, rest or pleasure where *should* you turn and WHY?

Read **Matthew 28.18-20**, **Matthew 9.6-8** and **Colossians 1.15-20**. In this week's story we get a taste of the authority of Jesus when he shows that He can provide food for five thousand with just five loaves and two fish. What do these verses say about Jesus' authority? How can knowing and believing the authority given to Jesus and what He is capable of help you in your day to day storms?

Pray for one another using the **P.R.A.Y.** model. PREACH the Gospel reminding one another that Jesus is the great Comforter, has been given all authority and satisfies all needs, wants and desires. Confess and repent of not believing this truth and instead running to other false idols. Then ASK for the Holy Spirit, who is your Helper and with you to point you to God's Grace. Ask Him to help you turn to prayer more, the Word more and your Gospel-centered friends. Lastly, YIELD, with thanksgiving.
