Ecclesiastes 5.1-7 // June 2, 2019

POETRY IN MOTION

Command: ¹ Guard your steps when you go to the house of God. Reason: To draw near to listen is better than to offer the sacrifice of fools, for they do not know that they are doing evil.

Command: ² Be not rash with your mouth, nor let your heart be hasty to utter a word before God,

Reason: for God is in heaven and you are on earth.

Conclusion: Therefore let your words be few.

Proverb: ³ For a dream comes with much business, and a fool's voice with many words.

Command: ⁴ When you vow a vow to God, do not delay paying it, Reason: for he has no pleasure in fools. Conclusion: Pay what you vow. Proverb: ⁵ It is better that you should not vow than that you should vow and not pay.

Command: ⁶ Let not your mouth lead you into sin, and do not say before the messenger that it was a mistake.

Reason: Why should God be angry at your voice and destroy the work of your hands? Proverb: ⁷ For when dreams increase and words grow many, there is vanity; Conclusion: but God is the one you must fear.

A NEW TEMPLE

Hebrews 10.1-25 // Ephesians 2.18-21

When comparing the words of the Preacher in Ecclesiastes with that of the author of Hebrews and Ephesians, we seem to find ourselves in what seems like a contradiction. Do we guard ourselves as we approach God, with fear and silence? Or do we go with boldness and assurance, in confidence drawing near to this holy God?

In light of the final sacrifice of Jesus, we recognize the depth of His grace as we view His love towards us in the cross. Yet in light of that same final sacrifice, we recognize the depth of His holiness as we view His hatred towards sin.

LEARNING TO WALK

In prayer it is better to have a heart without words than to have words without heart. -John Bunyan

Prayer is less like a megaphone for you to tell God what you want, and more like a stethoscope that reveals what is in your heart. Our words, and our actions, reveal the contents of our heart. We must learn to take our thoughts captive and allow the ugly truth of our heart's state be acknowledged. It is only then that we can truly start to be transformed into people whose words are more honest, and whose walk follows those words.

Your Life Mission



Even the smallest step towards sharing your faith (such asking someone over, getting coffee, striking up a conversation at work during your break rather than staring at your phone, etc.) is a step in the direction of fulfilling that commitment and should be seen as a victory.

What opportunities or conversations or social settings with non-believers are on the horizon or in your calendar that you could use prayer for, that you might be able to encourage them and help them find the love and strength of God? How can your group be praying for the people in your life that you love and care for?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love. Make sure to end your time of prayer Yielding with Thanksgiving for God's sovereignty and plan for your life.
