NOTES:

I CAN'T GET NO SATISFACTION

Hebrew writers would often use many different forms of literary forms, particularly in their poetry. One form is called a "chiasm structure," which includes a pattern, akin to a boomerang, with thoughts and motifs going out to a main point, and returning on a type of parallel or symmetrical pattern.

THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE VANITY

The Preacher observes that it is a tragedy when someone goes through life unable to enjoy what God has given. The person who has received from God, but either is never thankful or is bitter about what has been withheld or taken is living a tragic existence. He seems to quote Job, who said, "naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return" (Job 1.21). But Job continues and says, "the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the Name of the Lord."

THE CONCLUSION

Knowing that chasing wealth and not being content in life will not bring us satisfaction, he concludes from verse 18 and culminating in verse 20 that the person who receives with gladness from God and learns to enjoy and trust what has been given (and what has not been given) is a man who will have a short memory, forgetting what is behind and enjoying the day that the Lord has currently made for him.


Your Life Mission
