SUFFERING AS A GIFT?

Philippians 1.27-30

AN UNLIKELY (AND UNWANTED!) GIFT

Philippians 1.27-30

Paul tells us that "it has been granted" to us that we would believe in Him. We were given the gift of faith! What an amazing gift! But he says that not only do we receive that gift, but also we are granted suffering! Notice they are joined by a single verb, meaning that they both are given from God in the same way.

Greek: charizomai. You may know that the word *charis* in Greek is "gift" or "grace." This is the verb form of "gift," and it is translated as "granted," because the object (here it is "believing" and "suffering") is being "freely given" as a gift.

GOD IS PURPOSEFUL AND SOVEREIGN OVER ALL THINGS

Habakkuk 1.1-10, 2.4

Here, Habakkuk questions God. Nothing in life makes sense. God seems to be an absentee slumlord. But He tells Habakkuk, "look, son, I know you don't see it, and it looks crazy. But even if I pulled back the curtain and showed you what My purpose in it all was, you still wouldn't believe me. I'm that good."

What is truly more comforting? A God who is not in control of everything, with Satan just having his way?Or a God who is wisely in control of every detail of every second of every day of every person's life?

WHY WE SHOULD RECEIVE THE GIFT BY FAITH

2 Corinthians 4.16-18

Three Reasons Why We Should Receive the Gift of Suffering by Faith:

- 1. We can give thanks for what it does in you. James 1.2-4, Romans 5.3-5
 - a. When we physically work out, we get stronger from resistance. In our faith, resistance is what builds up our "spiritual muscle."
- 2. We can give thanks for what it accomplishes for others
- a. You desire to be a blessing for others, don't you? Being able to be deeply empathetic and walk arm in arm with someone through their suffering can change others' lives.
- 3. We can give thanks for what it does to bring glory and honor to Christ.
- a. Our response in suffering is what magnifies Him more than all.
- b. Verse 29 even says it is "for the sake of Christ."

This Week's Scripture to Memorize:

John 1:14

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, ask if anyone is able to recite the memory verse.

Read **Philippians 1:27-30**. What was noteworthy, thought-provoking or encouraging from this week's sermon or Scripture?

Most of us probably gladly accept God's blessings in our lives. Read **Philippians 3:10**, **Matthew 10:38-39**, and **1 Peter 4:16**. Do we just as gladly accept suffering in our lives? Why or why not? What are we believing or not believing that might drive this acceptance or lack of acceptance?

Read James 1:2-4, Romans 5:3-4, and 2 Corinthians 1:3-4. How can God use suffering in our lives to glorify Him or build us and others up?

Can you recall a time where God allowed suffering in your life? Was it used for His glory? If so, how? Did it teach you something about God's character or His plan for you?

Read **Habakkuk 1:1-4**. Habakkuk questions God's plan and what He is allowing. Now read verses **5-10**. What does God tell him? How then should we perceive suffering or injustices today?

Read Isaiah 45:6-7, Isaiah 55: 8-11, Proverbs 16:4, and Romans 8:28. What do these verses tell us about God's sovereignty and faithfulness? Does it change the way we feel about suffering and the struggles we see in our world?

At our monthly **Prayer Meeting** a couple weeks ago, we discussed allowing more time for prayer in our **Community Groups** and asked God for an increased desire for prayer. Take extra time throughout your week to ask God to give us that desire for prayer. Pray for the people in your group. Ask God specifically to be glorified in our suffering and the suffering we see in our world. Once at your group, consider breaking off into smaller groups to pray for each other's hearts as you go through times of difficulty and suffering, that God would be glorified in their life, and in the lives around them.
