### LOVING THE LEAST, LAST, AND LOST

James 1.26-2.13

#### TRUE RELIGION

Two phrases that give us a framework not just for this section, but for the whole book of James, are found in **James 1.26, 27**. James is clear that our religion can either be "worthless" or "true."

**TRUE RELIGION:** Today, we often categorize "religion" as being a set of rituals or beliefs, and we often give it a negative connotation of being empty and just "going through the motions." But here, James uses the phrase meaning a genuine faith, love, and devotion to Jesus. This changes everything when it comes to us claiming what "religion" we are!

#### JESUS DIDN'T COME TO SAVE THE RIGHTEOUS

Matthew 9.9-13 // Luke 18.10-14 // James 2.8-10

Jesus tells us He didn't come to save the righteous or help the healthy, but the sick. Why? Because the healthy don't think they need help. They are self-righteous and in their pride they reject any help. This will lead to a contempt for others who aren't "as good" as us. But James reminds them that we have all fallen short and we are all spiritually "sick" and in need of a Savior.

### "LOOK AFTER"

Matthew 25.31-46

James uses the phrase "look after," and it's a phrase that denotes a deep caring for of others. Jesus exhorts us, as does James, to really care for those who are down and out, in particular the poor, orphans, and widows. He even Himself identifies with them, because these are the very ones He came to help.

The very heart of the Gospel was sending Jesus to rescue spiritual orphans.

To be image bearers of God, we should also aim to be "sent" to rescue orphans, both spiritual and physical.

Make no mistake, good works do *not* earn our salvation. Rather, good works serve as an *evidence* that we have been made new and are growing in our true religion, our true love, trust, and devotion to God.


