THE HIGH PRIESTLY PRAYER

John 17.15 // August 8, 2021

JESUS' FINAL STOP

On his last stop before His arrest, Jesus prays, presumably at the Temple, and stands before God as the Faithful and True High Priest, as well as to present Himself as the sacrificial Lamb of God. The angels long watched godly men come and go, but never once did anyone even come close to being able to satisfy the righteous requirements of the Law in order to gain forgiveness for sins. But here at Jesus' final stop, He presents Himself both as High Priest and the acceptable Lamb.

The glory of God will most extravagantly be made known through the utter humiliation of God.

THE GLORY OF CHRIST

If the angels are astounded by what they see in the story and work of salvation, we ought to also be forever amazed at what God has done. It is one thing to be amazed at the power of God: His wrath, justice, and even His ability to be raised from the dead. However, it is God's humility and self-sacrificing love towards sinful enemies that makes this story and plan of salvation most improbable.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most important event of human history.

But the incarnation of Jesus Christ is the most implausible.

That an almighty and holy God would become a baby for the sake of sinners is, ultimately, wonderfully beyond our comprehension.

THIS IS ETERNAL LIFE

Jesus reveals to us in His prayer how eternal life is attained. It is only by knowing God Almighty, and knowing Him, Jesus Christ. Salvation is not gained through morality, good works, or religion, nor is it negated by our failures or our faults.

Jesus does not say

"You have given Me authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all who have strong faith."

No...He says

You have given Me authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom You have given to Me.

Read John 17.1-5. What stands out in this passage and from the sermon on Sunday?

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

o Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.

Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)


o Real repentance begins where blame-shifting stops. Your circumstances don't need to change, your heart needs to change. Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.

Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

o Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

o End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
