FORGIVENESS & THE GOSPEL

Matthew 6:9-15, 18:21-35

- It is not possible to receive forgiveness from God while simultaneously withholding forgiveness from others.
- If we experience the Gospel, the Gospel will flow into our relationships with people.

I. THE CHAIN EFFECT OF FORGIVENESS

- Receiving forgiveness from God is inextricably tied to understanding the greatness of our debt of sin.
- The realization of our debt of sin and our inability to ever repay brings us to the humble receiving of forgiveness through the Cross.
- That same humility expresses itself in forgiving those who have sinned against us. Colossians 3:12-14
- The proud heart does not receive forgiveness even as it does not give forgiveness
- The proud underestimate their debt to God and overestimate other's debt to them
- The humble giving of forgiveness to those who sin against us is a powerful communication of the Gospel
 Acts 7:55-60 The martyrdom of Stephen, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them."

II. UNFORGIVENESS REALLY DOES LEAD TO TORMENT

Matthew 18:34-35

- Unresolved offenses result in bitterness that imprisons us in new relationships we are "tortured". The wounds of past unforgiven offenses poison every new relationship.
- Unforgiveness gives place for the Devil to work in our lives. **Ephesians 4:26-27**
- . Unforgiveness is even linked by scientists to medical conditions such as arthritis, high blood pressure, etc.

III. THE CONNECTION BETWEEN OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AND OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH EACH OTHER

- Our relationship with God is woven in to the fabric of our relationship with each other. We cannot break
 one thread without breaking the other.
 - 1 Corinthians 12:12-26 the body of Christ, one member cannot say of another "I do not need you."
- To withhold forgiveness is to say "I have no need of you"
 Matthew 22:35-40 "The Great Commandment." 1 John 4:19-21

IV. UNDERSTANDING WHAT FORGIVENESS IS AND WHAT IT ISN'T

- "Forgiveness is surrendering my right to hurt you for hurting me." -- Dr. Archibald Hart
- Forgiveness is the cancelling of a debt
- Forgiveness is not the absence of anger against sin ("Be angry and do not sin" Eph 4:26)
- Forgiveness does not mean you pretend the offense didn't really hurt or wasn't really costly
- Forgiveness does not mean you trust the offender forgiveness is freely given, but trust is earned.

"When we strive against all thoughts of revenge; when we will not do our enemies mischief, but wish well to them, grieve at their calamities, pray for them, seek reconciliation with them, and show ourselves ready on all occasions to relieve them." - **Thomas Watson** (1620-1686), Body of Divinity

- A fruit of forgiveness is that the memory of the offense loses its "power" in my life today.
- Forgiveness means I give the judgment of the offense over to the Lord to deal with

Romans 12:14-21 – "never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine. I will repay, says the Lord."

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 6:9-15 and Matthew 18:21-35 . What stuck out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
Read Colossians 3:12-14. How does receiving God's forgiveness for all of your past, present and future sins tie directly with forgiving others?
Read Ephesians 4:26-27 . How could NOT forgiving others hurt you?
Read Luke 23:32-34 . What is happening in these verses? Who is forgiving who?
Read Romans 5:6-10, 1 John 4:19-21 and Romans 12:14-21 . Why is it important for you to remember that Jesus forgave His enemies in the moment they murdered Him? How does His example motivate you to forgive?
Matthew 22:35-40. Can you be both loving and unforgiving? How are they tied together?
What is stopping you from forgiving others? Bitterness? Hurt? Fear? Hard heart? Do you want revenge? What part of the Gospel are you not believing?
What is stopping you from forgiving yourself? Guilt and shame? Self-worship? Do you doubt or are you forgetting the Gospel?
Re-read the Thomas Watson quote that Pastor Ron Ohst read on Sunday along with the verses next to each statement. "When we strive against all thoughts of revenge (Romans 12:19); when we will not do our enemies mischief (1 Thessalonians 5:15), but wish well to them (Luke 6:28), grieve at their calamities (Proverbs 24:17), pray for them (Matthew 5:44), seek reconciliation with them (Romans 12:18), and show ourselves ready on all occasions to relieve them." (Exodus 23:4). Which action step(s) do you need to take in order to forgive others?
Spend some time praying for one another, confessing sin if you have not been forgiving to others, maybe someone specifically. Thank God the Father that He

sent His Son to die and shed His blood for the forgiveness of your sin. Ask the Holy

Spirit to help empower you and forgive like our loving, gracious Father forgives.
