THE GIFT (AND NEED) OF ENCOURAGEMENT

Philippians 2.19-30

TRAVELING ENCOURAGERS

It may seem odd to find a travel itinerary in the middle of Philippians, but there is much to glean from. Here, Paul describes two men, Timothy and Epaphroditus, and what he says about them gives us much to model.

Both are examples of ordinary men, not super stars, that are content with being ordinary, are team players, aren't self-absorbed, and are otherly-minded.

EXAMPLES OF FAITHFUL ENCOURAGERS

Philippians 2.20-27

Paul describes Timothy saying there is "no one like him" and cites both their genuine concern for others. He speaks of Timothy's "proven worth" and loyalty as a son to a father. Both risk their own needs for the ministry. **How do we encourage the people in our own lives like this?**

Spouse: We so easily focus on the negative, things we want to change. We nag, complain, compare to other spouses, and have unrealistic expectations. This will never produce an environment or relationship that encourages growth.

Proverbs 27.15-17

Children: Parents, you can wear your children out by having such high expectations of them, focusing in on their faults, you will create people-pleasers and eventual adults who will be performance driven rather than grace driven.

Colossians 3.21

Other Believers: The Word tells us in **Hebrews 10.24**, **25** that we should stir each other up by being together and encouraging one another. We need each other to fill the tank.

Friends, Co-Workers, Non-Believers: Paul tells us in **Colossians 4.5, 6** that we should walk in wisdom toward non-believers and have our speech always seasoned with salt. This is a picture of a person whose speech leaves someone encouraged, not condemned.

Affirm the positive evidences of God's grace you see in the lives of those God has put in your life. Be the person, like Timothy, that others say, "I have no one like him."

Train your eyes to see God's grace working others' lives; retrain your eyes to not automatically go to being critical and fault finding.

ENCOURAGE YOUR ENCOURAGERS

Paul also gives us instruction on how to treat those who are in our lives who encourage us. Remember, Jesus said, "it is more blessed to give than to receive." Receive from your encouragers, but give back. "Receive [them] in the Lord with all joy, and honor [them]."

One reason we might not encourage others is because they either don't encourage us, they always discourage us, or they just make it hard to find positive things to focus on. On Sunday, Pastor Jobey reminded us to consider Christ. When we withhold encouragement from others due to our disappointment, how does that compare to Christ's patience, acceptance, and long suffering with us, even though we are constantly failing and struggling through sin? How can truly and more deeply believing the Gospel for yourself change the way you encourage others in your life?

Finally, look at Romans 15:4-7. Now spend time discussing some practical ways that each of you can build up and strengthen your brothers and sisters in Christ. Then pray that our hearts would be encouraged by the Gospel that we may speak life into those that God has placed in our lives.
