THE BIBLICAL BASIC FOR FASTING

Matthew 6:6-18

WITHOUT HYPOCRISY

- Jesus doesn't tell us to fast, rather He assumes that we will be fasting.
- Fasting is not something we parade before people.
- Jesus says, anoint your head, wash your face. Don't let people see that you are going without food - don't get sympathy or praise from them.
- We fast before the Lord, not before our fellow brothers and sisters.

Matthew 9:14-15

TIED TO LOSS

- Jesus links fasting with mourning, with sorrow, with pain, with need and loss.
- Fasting, throughout the Old Testament and even New Testament was always tied to some level of sorrow or anxiety.
- One Day of Fasting: The Israelites would fast and seek the face of the Lord to forgive them of their sins during Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement).
- Christians natural instinct should be that when something happens that
 we care very deeply about we dedicate ourselves to prayer and fasting
 in order to seek the mercy and kindness of God.
- Fasting comes naturally when we care enough. Sometimes we simply fail to care about the things that are happening around us.

'The prayer of a Christian is not an attempt to force God's hand, but a humble acknowledgement of helplessness and dependence. When we are on our knees, we know that it is not we who control the world; it is not in our power, therefore, to supply our own needs by our own independent efforts; every good thing that we desire for ourselves and for others must be sought from God, and will come, if it comes at all, as a gift from His good hand.'

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Have you ever fasted over anything? If so, what was it like, why did you fast? OR have you ever heard of a story of someone who fasted, and God showed up to answer their prayer?

Read Matthew 6:16-18. What is going on in this passage? Do you think Jesus directs us to fast in this passage?

What is Jesus warning us against? How can this temptation to show off our good deeds infiltrate our lives? Read Isaiah 58:3-7: how were the Israelites doing this wrona?

(Staying in Matthew 6) What is the direction that Jesus gives to Christians when they fast? How will doing it in secret be beneficial?

Read Matthew 9:14-15. What is happening in this passage? What does Jesus closely tie fasting with? Why was fasting unnecessary when Jesus was with them?

Since we live in the time where the Bridegroom has been taken away, is Jesus expecting that we will fast? What are some things that would cause us to fast?

Read Joel 1:11-14; Joel 2:12; Ezra 8:21-23; Nehemiah 1:1-4; Psalm 35:11-14; 2 Samuel 1:12; 2 Samuel 3:31-35; 2 Samuel 12:15-16; Daniel 9:3-5; Acts 13:2-4; Acts 14:23; Esther 4:16 (You don't have to do all of these, but choose at least one from every book). How do these examples help us to understand what fasting is in the Bible? What kind of events prompt us towards fasting?

Does fasting work all the time? What should we keep in mind when we fast?

What are some of the reasons we don't fast? What things ought to break our hearts but often don't?

How can we make room in our lives for fasting for these things?
