1 Corinthians 9.1-14

THE MOTIVE TO CARE

1 Corinthians 9.1, 2 // 2 Corinthians 10.10-12

The Corinthian culture would pay various leaders, but not out of generosity, but for control and manipulation. Though Paul had a biblical right to be taken care of for his Gospel work, he understood that taking their money would put him "in debt" to them.

PROVIDING FOR PROVIDERS

1 Corinthians 9.3-14

Paul agrees that he has the right to be provided for since he provides them with spiritual nourishment. Commentator David Prior mentions 5 angles Paul pursues.

- Ordinary Practice: People who provide should be provided for.
- Scriptural Precedent: The Law of Moses (Deuteronomy 25.4)
- Common Sense: Even animals aren't muzzled!
- Religious Custom: Both Jewish and pagan ministers are cared for.
- The Words of Jesus: Probably thinking of Matthew 10.10

GOD'S (AND PAUL'S) PASSION FOR HIS WORD

Paul says that Gospel workers should be taken care of, yet he himself denies care. Why, and which is it? The common denominator in this seeming contradiction is Paul's passion for the integrity of the mission and ministry of the Gospel

1 Timothy 5.17-19

Oxen: a muzzled ox will be weak, thin, exhausted, and distracted, which means less work, and poor work. The ox may even eventually collapse.

Soldiers: a soldier who provides his own equipment and training will be inept, unskilled, using inferior weapons, and unable to defend himself, much less others.

Farmers: farmers forbidden to enjoy their own crop will be tempted to find another line of work, and also become burned out and bitter towards the field owners.

God's passion for His Word makes provision for Gospel preachers to be cared for by a church body that loves God, His Word, and His servants. Our goal as a church family should be to preserve the integrity of the Gospel, however that looks, among our church family.

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the **Memory Verse**?

Read 1 Corinthians 9.1-14. What stands out to you in this passage, and what stuck out to you most from the sermon on Sunday?

What is the "common denominator" for Paul's command to provide for pastors, as well as his decision for he himself to not be paid?

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself

Without saying it explicitly, this section speaks volumes about God's passion for His Word to be preached in His church. What Gospel truth can you remind yourself about from this passage?

Repent and Confess

Does your generosity (whether to friends, the church, your kids, etc.) have strings attached? Or do you hold back generosity from your church or your friends? Based on this passage, what might you need to confess and repent of?

Ask for Provision

What might you ask God to help you with or provide for you in light of these passages?

Your Life Mission

God has called you out of darkness and adopted you. He has not only adopted you into His eternal Kingdom, but He has also lovingly placed you in a local church family to help you grow. As part of a natural family, we do our part to provide for the needs of the family (chores, work, cleaning, etc.). The same goes for the local church. How has God called you to work and serve and do "family chores" in the body of Christ? How about in your work, school, or neighborhood?

What conversations or social settings with non-believers are coming up that you could use prayer for? How can your group be praying for the people in your life that you love and care for?

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Make sure to end your time of prayer Yielding with Thanksgiving for God's sovereignty and plan for your life.
