JESUS THE AUTHORITATIVE HEALER

Matthew 7.28-8.17

JESUS' AUTHORITY TO HEAL

The Gospel of Matthew is broken up with an alternating pattern. Matthew goes from a "Discourse" of Jesus' teachings and then into a "Demonstration" of His authority. This happens 5 times in Matthew. The Sermon on the Mount (Chapters 5-7) is the first "Discourse," and now we go into Chapter 8, the first "Demonstration."

Matthew 7.28-8.13

Here, Jesus is shocked at the kind of faith coming out of a Gentile. The Jews themselves had not expressed this kind of faith, and here Jesus gives us another "premonition" of the Great Commission, that "many will come from east and west" in the "kingdom of heaven." This is a reference to other nations coming to faith.

If Christ is not Lord of all. He is not Lord at all.

Hebrews 1.3 // Colossians 1.15-18

OUR FUTURE HOPE

Matthew 7.28-8.13

As Jesus had described the Kingdom and Kingdom living in Chapters 5-7, He now demonstrates and proves that He not only teaches in authority (**7.29**), but also actually *has* real authority: the authority of God Himself, who alone has authority over sickness and death. Here, He proves that He is here to fulfill even prophesies about the Messiah, the one who will take "our illnesses" and "diseases."

Many circles of Christianity, under the very broad umbrella of the "Prosperity Gospel," laud this verse out of context to say that since Jesus broke the power of sin and death on the cross, we are now no longer under the curse and can have all the blessings of the Kingdom now and in totality. But this is simply not true. We still are awaiting the full consummation, when Christ defeats in finality.

1 Corinthians 15.24-26 // Revelation 21.3-7

But when Jesus returns, will we be found with faith like the Centurion?

Or faithlessness like the Jews,
resting in our Blessed Assumption?

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 7.28-8:17 . What verses stuck out or was most impactful from the sermon on Sunday?
Read Hebrews 1:3, Colossians 1:15-18 . What do we learn about Jesus in these verses and why is it important to know this characteristic about him?
Read Matthew 28:18 . What authority has Jesus been given?
How does knowing that Jesus is in control, ruling and reigning, above all things, in control of sickness, death, and diseases effect the way you pray for healing?
Re-read Matthew 8:4. Why does it seem that Jesus wants to keep this miracle of healing a secret?
On Sunday, Jobey read a quote from Joyce Meyer that said "I am not poor. I am not miserable and I am not a sinner. That is a lie from the pit of hell. That is what I were and if I still was then Jesus died in vain. I'm going to tell you something folks. I didn't stop sinning until I finally got it through my thick head I wasn't a sinner anymore. And the religious world thinks that's heresy and they want to hang you for it. But the Bible says that I am righteous and I can't be righteous and be a sinner at the same time." Now read Matthew 5:3, Luke 6:20, Philippians 3:8, Romans 7:18 and Luke 18:14. What are your thoughts on this quote? Is it biblical?
Although we as Christians are clearly not perfect and most would agree that life often feels like a daily grind, a truth that we do know is Jesus' blood has healed us from the power over sin in our lives. We are in the middle part of the Gospel story. Read Isaiah 53:3-5, 1 Peter 2:24. How does knowing that Jesus' blood has healed you of past sins motivate you to continue live a godly life and pick up your cross to follow Jesus?
Read 1 Peter 2:9-11. Spend some time writing down the who "you once were" by listing your old desires, pursues, hurts, and sin(s) you struggled with. Then list imperfect, yet "healed by the blood" version that you are today. Do you see a big difference from before you were healed by the blood and today? How has Jesus healed and cleansed you of past sins, hurts or struggles?
1 Corinthians 15:24-26, Revelation 21:3-7 and Revelation 7-9:17. Although we are not yet fully healed and perfected, what truths do we have to look forward to? What's the conclusion of the Gospel story look like?
End the group, praying in love (1 Corinthians 14:1) and reminding one another of how Jesus has healed us from the power of sin, also thanking Him for our glorious
