Matthew 18.15-35

### FRIENDSHIP, DISCIPLESHIP, AND CHURCH DISCIPLINE

#### Matthew 18.15-20

This passage, along with 1 Corinthians 5, is the most clear picture of what we commonly call "church discipline." Many churches, if not most, don't really do what is called upon here. But it is terribly important for the health of the church, as well as the person in sin, as it exudes not only love for the person and the church, but also a deep love for Christ.

# Punishment is meant to make someone pay, discipline is to help someone grow.

#### If someone is in sin...

1. Go directly to them privately. This is best done in the context of real friendship.

2. If they don't repent, go with others who also love them.

3. If they persist in unrepentant sin, go to church leaders.

### BINDING, LOOSING, AND DOING GOD'S WILL

#### 1 Corinthians 5.1-13

The curious statement that what we bind and loose on earth will be done so in heaven is interesting. It reminds us that though God can do what He wants as He wants it, He has chosen to use us, His church, to do His will. He specifically has given the church the authority to enact His judgments and discipline. He honors what the church does in His Name. This does *not* mean the church can do anything she wants or is infallible, but rather that when she acts in Jesus' Name and according to His will. He will back it up.

Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate. **-Dietrich Bonhoeffer** 

### FORGIVING 70X7

The goal of forgiving someone is to see them restored unto Christ. We don't take sides, unless the side we take is the side of Christ and His righteousness. We should want to see everyone, the sinner and the sinned against, to be victorious and to succeed in Christ.

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# COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read **Matthew 18:15-35**. What stuck out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

On Sunday, Jobey talked about church disciple and how it starts on a friendship level. In reading this week's text, what would the biblical process look like for "calling out" or rebuking a friend in love? List the steps.

Read Hebrews 12:5-9. What's the difference between punishment and discipline?

Read **Hebrews 12:10-14**. Why do we as Christians need to hold each other accountable, call out sin and lovingly rebuke one another? What's the main goal?

How do you react when a friend, spouse or church leader lovingly "calls you out" on a sin in your life, or reveals a "blind spot"? If so, how did you react? If you reacted negatively what would you do different next time? When receiving loving rebuke how do you typically respond?

Read **Hebrews 12:1-4**. How will we see discipline as something done for our own good and growth? Who and what do we need to be constantly gazing at? \_\_\_\_\_

Who in your life that has hurt you and you need to forgive? Do you want to see them succeed in Christ, or do you want to see them pay for what they did? Consider the story Jesus told in Matthew 18.21-35. How does your attitude or desire reflect best in the story? Are you like the man who demanded that someone who owed him something should pay him back or be punished? If so, what will help your heart to change?

End group and your personal study time with prayer. Pray using the P.R.A.Y. model. PREACH the Gospel, reminding one another that because Jesus has humbled Himself to the point of death on a cross now we have access to God the Father. Confess and repent of not seeing both the Bigness and Smallness of God. The Bigness that controls everything, the smallness that showed us how relational He is. Then ASK for the Holy Spirit, who is your Helper and with you to continue to increase your view of the awesomeness of your Father. Ask Him to help you turn to prayer more, the Word more and your Gospel-centered friends. Lastly, YIELD, with thanksgiving.
