Philippians 2.19-30

## LEGALISM: THE ENEMY OF THE CROSS

After Paul would evangelize, often times others would come in, Jews who had such a zeal they wanted others to live up to the Jewish Law. They would often call themselves "the Circumcision," because circumcision was given to the Jews as an outward sign of what was going on in the inside of them. But as humans do, instead of it being evidence of our love for God, it became a sign of our own pride in our obedience, rather than a sign of God's grace towards us.

Ironically, though these Jews would offen call Gentiles "dogs," now Paul is calling these Jews the real "dogs," and that they are just people who mutilate the flesh. He claims, now, that "we are the circumcision."

Romans 2.28, 29

## **ACCIDENTAL PHARISEES**

It's easy for us to bag on the Pharisees, like we poke fun at guys like Peter. But in reality, we probably can find far more similarities with them than we care to admit. We need to understand at least two things about the Pharisees:

- 1) Like most genuine believers, the Pharisees strived to live up to the highest possible standard. They wanted to do all they could to honor God and His Word to every degree.
- 2) We may laugh at some of their extra rules, but they derived their rules based on the result of a rigorous study of Scripture.

The problem lies within our belief that everyone else should look just as we look. When we have our passion (orphan care, missions, bible study, homeless ministry, homeschooling, certain theologies/topics), we might start to notice that some will lag behind and not share the same degree of passion as we do. We see this as a "problem."

Larry Osborne says, ""If you continue farther down the path of contempt for those who fail to keep up, you'll end up in a place of arrogance. Fewer and fewer people will measure up to your definition of a genuine disciple...and your metamorphosis will be complete. You will have arrived at a place you never intended to go. You'll be a full-fledged Pharisee. Accidental, no doubt. But a Pharisee nonetheless."

Luke 18.9-14

## HOPE FOR THE UNRELIGIOUS ... AND THE PHARISEE

What is the solution for the unreligious and struggling Christian? Are you not "feeling" God in your life? Are you in a dry season with no passion for the Word or prayer? Do you not compare well to others? Or maybe for the accidental Pharisee; do you recognize your pride and arrogance or smugness towards others? Do you see the subtle disdain you have for people who aren't like you? There is hope for both, and the solution is the same: **Do Your ABC's.** 

- Admit your sin
- Believe the Promises of God
- Confess your need and desire for faith

You say, "God have mercy on me, a sinner." Confess to both God and others how you have sinned against Him and wronged others. But then believe that God is at work in you, that He desires to help you change and grow for His sake, your sake, and others' sake.

## COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before group starts, is there anyone who can recite the week's memory verse?

Read Philippians 3:1-11. What impacted you the most from this Scripture or from Sunday's message?

Paul had every reason to have confidence in the flesh, but he chose not to. In what ways do you tend to put your confidence in the flesh (i.e. workplace, parenting, relationships with others, etc.)?

In the sermon notes, read under the section "Accidental Pharisees," starting with Number 1 and through the Larry Osborne quote. In what ways do you tend to put confidence in your flesh when it comes to your faith? In other words, what "badges" do you wear or expect others to wear as proof that they are "real disciples"?

What has the "fruit" been of that attitude, whether you actually express it out loud or you keep it hidden inside? Do certain people avoid you, or feel unable to live up to you? Do you get bitter or frustrated with people? Do you complain to God?

On Sunday Pastor Jobey shared the story of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Read Luke 18:9-14. Do you see yourself more like the Pharisee or the Tax Collector?

Who do you secretly "thank God that you are not like?" What makes us feel holier than others? See Isaiah 64:6.

Paul counted all his worldly gains as loss. Why? In our achievement driven culture what would this look like in your life if you actually counted all your worldly gains as loss?

Read Matthew 16:24-26. Spend some time during group to confess and pray about the things that prevent you from taking up your cross daily.
