HOW TO USE THIS TEST

This is a tool to help discern whether (or how closely) a man is qualified to be an elder.

For any man who is seriously being considered for appointment as an Elder, the test should be taken by:

- 1) The man himself.
- 2) All the Elders who know him.
- 3) His wife (or roommate).
- 4) Other leaders who are close to him.

For those aspiring to leadership but not close to being appointed, the test should be taken by:

- 1) The man himself.
- 2) The Elder who knows him best.
- 3) His wife (or roommate).

After this test is taken, the results should be discussed by the leadership and shared with the man whose life is being scrutinized. After taking the test, you will read on page 16 further instructions on how to use the results.

PRESCRIPTION AND DESCRIPTION

Church leadership, as with many other biblical doctrines, are exposed in the Word by both *prescription* as well as *description*. With Eldership, the Word shows us actual, specific requirements that are *prescribed* for Eldership (all but one are character issues); additionally, however, the Word also variously *describes* the role and task of an Elder through other biblical texts, stories, and correspondence, primarily in the New Testament Epistles.

To get an accurate picture of the role and character of an Elder, we will look at both of these elements to assess the aspiring Elder.
